Halton award to Halton Hills' group

Among those recognized for Halton Awards of Excellence at recent ceremonies at Halton Region was Amnesty International's Halton Hills Group 196.

The awards were established in 1998 to recognize Halton residents and organizations who have worked to reduce hate crimes, racism or biases based on age, sex, ethnic or racial origin. Halton Police Service, the North Halton Cultural Awareness Council, the Halton

Multicultural Council and the Region take part in announcing the awards with CAVEAT, which was founded in 1992 following the abduction and murder of Nina de Villiers.

Halton Hills Amnesty International's profile said the group worked tirelessly on a monthly basis writing letters to countless government authorities and prison officials on behalf of prisoners who have been unjustly detained because of their beliefs, ethnic origin or sex, and who have not used or advocated violence.

Among others recognized were:

Const. Michael Brown - Over 12 years, Const. Brown has delivered seminars to the Police Service and to the Police Service Board on racism. His actions and delivery of this information has gone a long way to overcome the gap between the police and visible minorities both inside and outside our community.

Willie Campos - having spent two years as president, and as an outstanding volunteer at the Halton Multicultural Council, Mr. Campos has successfully promoted respect for diver-

sity and positive race relations in the Halton community. He is a constant helping force behind the Canada Day Multicultural Festival, the Carousel of Nations and Hands Across the World.

Debbie Mahaffy - Debbie is an active member of many groups dealing with crime and violence prevention and victims' issues. Through ACTION, the group she was instrumental in starting a petition against Serial Killer Trading Cards, board and video games, and "slasher" videos. In Burlington she organizes and hosts the annual Memorial Day for Victims of Crime.

Women Survivors Advisory Group "Halton" - This group's purpose is to bring a survivor's perspective to all activities of the Halton Violence Prevention Council and to support and promote community awareness regarding violence against women and children in Halton. The group is made up of women from Halton who are survivors of violence and reflects the diversity of the community with respect to age, religion, ethno-racial background, disability, urban/rural and north/south residency.

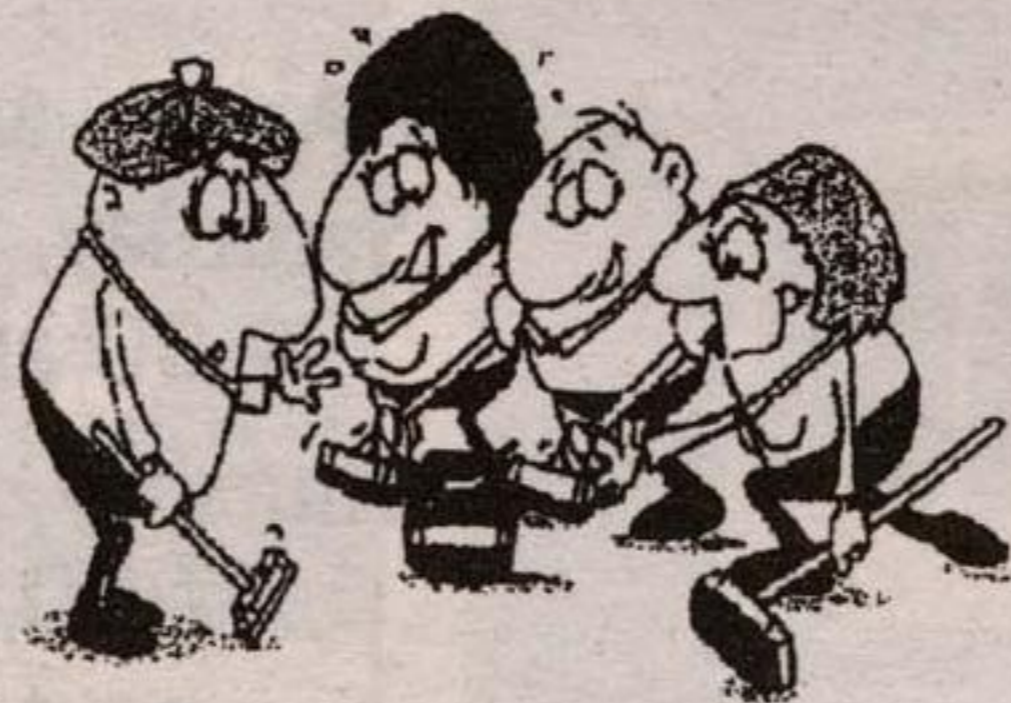
