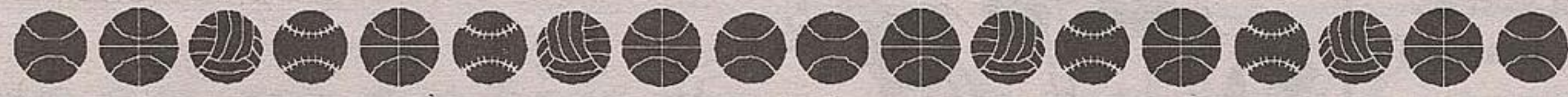

Boys Under 13 Select played hard at last weekend's North Peel-Halton Select Boys Final Cup Day in Bolton.

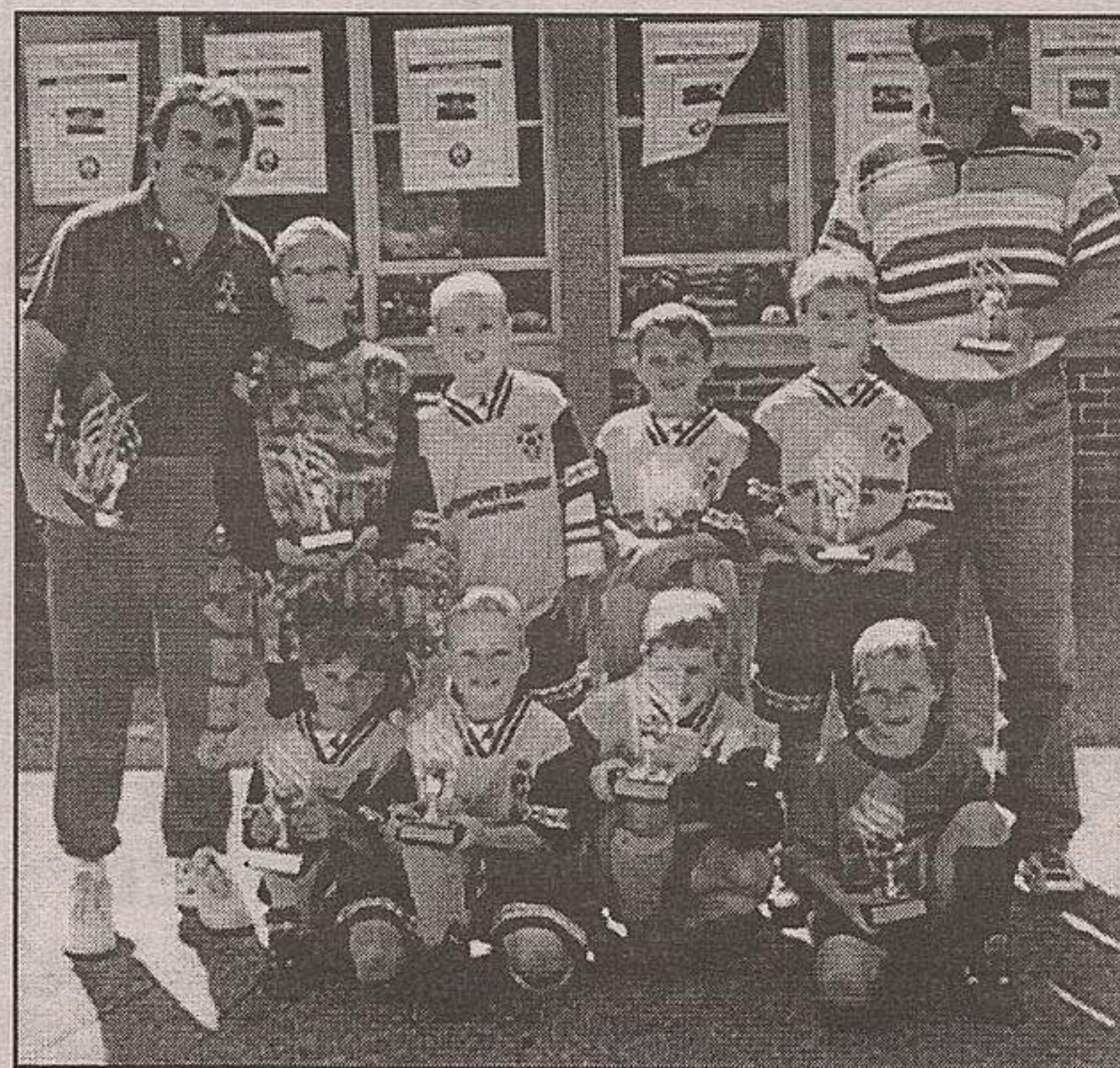
They won their first game

Hockey clinics for coaches

Involved in coaching hockey?

Halton Hills Recreation and parks Dept. is running a series of programs to educate coaches, referees, trainers, etc. at arenas and schools in Acton and Georgetown.

The next one in Acton is

at the new arena on Thursday, Sept. 30 from 6:30 to 10 p.m. Fee is \$15. This prevention program promotes what is acceptable and teaches what is unacceptable behaviour in both hockey and life.

Designed for hockey volunteers the program is open to all coaches, trainers, referees, players and parents as part of OMHA's commitment to the betterment of hockey.

Participants will be taught the issue of power, definitions of abuse and harass-

ment and how to respond to abuse. All coaches must have this training by 2001.

Another is being held on Wednesday, Dec. 1 at Georgetown High school. That venue is also the place where a hockey trainer's certification program is being held on Saturday, Sept. 25 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. There's a fee of \$50.

Halton Hills volunteers on all programs receive half their fee back upon successful completion of the course.
