Parents told to use Acton Blvd. crossings

A member of the parent council at McKenzie Smith Bennett has some advice for a parent who thinks safety would be improved for his preschoolers if a parking ban

were switched from the west to the east side of Acton Boulevard.

"He should walk his kids to either the school crossing or to the crosswalk and then there wouldn't be any safety problem," said Susan McPhail.

Bob Thomson, who drops off his two children at the YMCA day care in MSB, is worried someone will get hit as they cross from the west side of the road where parking is allowed, to the school on the east side.

Acton Boulevard resident

Thomson said it makes

more sense to him to allow parking on the east side where there's a sidewalk in front of the school property. Thomson also said many parents regularly ignore the parking ban on the east side so just one lane of traffic can move on Acton Boulevard

before and after school.

When asked if he saw the logic in the suggestion that he use one of the of the two existing crossings, Thomson said, "Yeah, I don't know. You got to realize that these are toddlers... and all they know is that they get out (of the car) and they're in a hurry... it's the logistics of it," Thomson said, adding the situation is much worse in the winter when

the snow banks make it more dangerous to get out on the west side of the road.

Thomson said the day care is trying to help the congestion problem by asking its staff not to park in a small lot off Acton Boulevard, near the entrance, so parents can pull in safely to pick up and drop off their children.

The Town's traffic coordinator, Bob Butrym, said
traditionally they ban parking
on school or park frontages
for safety reasons and noted
that parking is already banned
on the east side of Acton
Boulevard, south of Mill
Street because it's school bus
loading zone. Butrym said the
safest, but most costly answer would have been to cut
parking bays into the boulevard on the east side.

Butrym said they are also looking at removing the stop sign for southbound Acton Boulevard traffic at Mill Street because there's now a full-time crossing guard on duty before and after school.


Thanks to Diane, the ladies now have a nice clean and re-painted sitting room off the kitchen. Thanks a lot.


