haps but just as much of a panorama is Regional Road 25 and the Campbellville Sideroad where they dip down the Escarpment into their respective valley. It will take your breath away if you go south on the Blue Springs Line (6th Line) and plunge down the Escarpment where it overlooks the Kelso Conservation Area.

There's things to do there as well. Halton Region Museum is holding a Thanksgiving dinner on Sunday, October 10 in the conservation area's 19th century homestead. Or, if you'd rather soar above the trees on the Autumn Colours Sky Ride in the same area, chair lift rides go to the top of the Escarpment on Monday from 11:00am to 4:00pm.

On top of the "mountain" you can explore the trail or enjoy the panoramic cliff-edge view and walk
