

Capital Paving was contracted for both the 4.4 - kilometre section from Silvercreek to Acton and the 5.4-kilometre stretch from Acton's west-

West of Acton, a process called "cold in place" was used. Equipment ground up the existing surface that was mixed with a small amount of emulsified liquid and laid back

"It's basically like asphalt but there's no heat involved," explained contract administrator Butch Braithwaite, adding a final layer of asphalt is then laid on top.

asphalt and some underlying gravel was ground together and then put back out, graded, compacted to form a hard surface and then cov-

"There are various process out there for doing the work and I think in this instance the Ministry had an ideal situation where there was roughly

the same length of road on both sides of Acton being done at the same time, Braithwaite said, adding he didn't know if one process cost more per kilometre than the other. Both sections of highway will be monitored to

see which wears better.




