
#### Tires taken

## Concern over lake-based water for Halton Hills

Halton Region has pulled the plug on draft approved housing applications in Georgetown until a proven well water supply is confirmed.

When tests showed pumping from the next proposed well would harm a wetland, the Region deferred draft approval of subdivisions and infilling until an alternate source of water can be found. Draft approval gives the landowner the right to pre-sell and pre-service lots.

While the deferral jolted some property owners and developers, Halton's director of planning and development, Andrew Hope, said there's no crisis; there's abundant ground water and the search for another well is underway.

After a briefing on the freeze by Halton staff, Ward 2 Councillor Kathy Gastle said she was regularly asked by the public how the Region would deal with the pressures of lake-based water – the so-called big pipe from Lake Ontario – for Halton Hills.

"We're not looking to bring lake-based water to Georgetown," Hope said, adding the master water supply plan calls for a phased introduction of a series of wells to supply Georgetown.

Hope said they're cautiously optimistic they will have a new well pumping within two years.


"Having said that, we do feel caution is the operative



word. We don't want to get ahead of ourselves in terms of allocating scarce water capacity."

There's enough water service capacity available to enable registration of 96 per

cent of the potential dwelling units in draft approved subdivisions and Halton will allow subdivision registrations on a first come first serve basis, up to Halton's ability to provide water service.
