Y2K means early Parade of Lights

Parade of Lights organizers have had to move their parade date forward a week (to Dec. 9) because police won't allow them to hold it closer to year end, says Murray Swanston.

The annual event, started by Third and Fourth Line neighbours (of Eramosa Township) and their friends, is unique because of its agricultural theme. Floats tend to be farm machinery decorated in imaginative ways while the chief jolly elf arrives on a selfpropelled combine complete with driver and beautiful Christmas lights and his bag of toys.

While others have wanted to participate in the parade, organizers stick to their theme

and limit floats to around 20 to prevent long delays for traffic on Highway Seven.

"We're using the same route as last year." Swanston says. "We'll come down the County Road to the north end of Main Street, turn west along Alma Street and go back up the Fourth Line."

The highway is to be closed from 7 p.m. to around 8:30 p.m. but there will be parking along the route as there was last year.

Come to Happy Returns, our thrift store, and after pur-




