

No decision yet on fate of old school

No decision has been made on removing or renovating the old school on old Highway 24, which once served as Eramosa Township's municipal office.

Guelph/Eramosa Township deputy reeve Les Foote says council had more pressing matters to deal with when the early September decision time rolled around so no decision has been made.

The building's fate was put before a public meeting in the early summer since council was loathe to destroy it, but really needs its site for extra ingress to the township works yard.

No concrete proposals have been put forward since that meeting and there are other halls available in the township to be used for meeting sites, Foote says. The structure sits across the driveway from Eramosa's new municipal office.

"Council understands it could cost considerable money, even as much at \$30,000, to relocate it," Foote says. "It's not even the original school. I understand it was built in the 1950s to replace a school that burned. That means it really doesn't even have any special heritage value."

Costs estimates for renovating it to use as a hall or rental facility of some type were approximately \$80,000 the public was told in July. No serious offers have come from would-be users so the entire project is temporarily on hold.


