Over the last 4.5 years he has played sledge hockey with the KW Sidwinders and was one of a province-wide group who showed up for a

demonstration tournament at the Acton arena in September.

Earlier this fall a call went out seeking new players to try out for the national sledge hockey team. Organizers felt the existing team members were getting a bit old and there was a need to prepare some new players to take their places when they were ready to retire, Bowden was told.



Bowden was one of three from the KW team who went to Ottawa in October to try out for the 15 spots on the national team. He and Billy Bridges of Guelph made that team and another KW team member, from Burlington, has been chosen as an alternate.

National team practices are held in Ottawa about once a month, Bowden says. Although Sweden and Norway are two of the world's strongest teams, the Canadian team is favoured to bring back a medal from the World Championships at Salt Lake City in March. They will also be the Canadian Sledge Hockey team for the 2002 Olympics which is also set in Salt Lake City, Utah.

The rules for sledge hockey are basically the same as for regular hockey, Bowden says. However players use modified hockey sticks to propel themselves around the ice by arm strength. The short sticks have a blade on one end for puck control and double figure skating picks on the other to dig into the ice for propulsion. In place of skates the players ride on sleds equipped with double skate blades on the bottom.


