Town protests decision to close Ag. Ministry offices

It will take political will, along with tight planning pollicies, to fight off the pressures of development on farmland in Halton Hills and Town councillors are worried current provincial policies will not protect local farmers.

In particular, the Town is protesting a decision by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMFRA) to close all of its field offices in the Greater Toronto Area, laying off 70 staff.

In a motion asking the province to reconsider the move and meet with OMAFRA and Town officials to discuss the issue, Acton Councillor Clark Somerville said the closing of the local office in Georgetown will deprive the farm community of an essential government serv-

"It's criminal that with the value of agriculture in the GTA there will not be an office for OMFRA which is forgetting how important agriculture is. It's just absolutely insane." Somerville said after Council endorsed the motion, adding only 10 per cent of farmers have access to the Web, yet that's how OMAFRA suggests farmers can now get the information and help they would have received from the field advisors.

The Halton Region Federation of Agriculture is also protesting the closures, arguing that OMAFRA is an essential tool in Ontario agriculture that shouldn't be further eviscerated by front line cutbacks.

A GTA agricultural economic impact study underlines the importance of agriculture to the economy of Halton and the GTA and identified urban sprawl and fragmentation of rural lands as major threats.

Agriculture generates approximately \$126 million in Halton annually and of the 23 municipalities in the GTA, Halton Hills has the highest gross farm receipts, valued as \$65 million.

There appears to be the political will at the Town Council table to protect agri-

cultural land – councillors have said recently they don't want Halton Hills to end up like Brampton with all of the farmland and open space paved over.

The GTA agricultural economic impact study shows between 1976 and 1996, the GTA lost 30 per cent of its farms and 16.5 per cent of its total farm acres. The report supports the protection of "clusters" of farms and agriculture-related industries
