Planning is the key to protecting Halton's groundwater and a pioneering report recommends restrictive zoning in the Official Plan to protect wellheads hydrogeologically sensitive areas from developments that

are commons sources of contaminants.

Prevention is now seen as the best way of ensuring a safe groundwater supply and Halton hydrologist, Steve Holysh, said the Region is a leader in groundwater management in Ontario.

Through a network of 21 wells, Halton supplies groundwater to about 60,000 people in Acton, Georgetown

Holysh said mapping shows hydrogeologically sensitive areas around Fairy Lake where there's a lot of sand and gravel or limestone with a shallow water table that needs to be protected.

past few years, questioned how the water taken by Blue Circle Aggregates during quarrying might affect her water.

"I want to make sure that we have enough water for the future, but I'm also here because I'm on the separate school council and we want to know how much water there is, so a lack of water can't be used as an excuse not build a new school,' Cox said.

Holysh said after collecting the technical information the next step is to turn the information into policy that will reduce groundwater pollution. The draft report is being circulated to the local municipalities for input. Final approval by council is expected by May.


Enjoy the sunshine. I think Spring is coming. To all who are ill, we wish a speedy recovery and hope to see you at the Branch soon.


