Ticket trauma

The Town will look into easing parking restrictions in the congested Kingham Road area following a letter from a woman complaining her daughter received five Town parking tickets in the past two months for the "crime" of parking overnight on the street.

With parking at a premium. the existing 12-hour parking area is full by early evening and the resident asked for an extension of the 12-hour parking area From Greenore to Duby Road or parking all along Greenore Crescent. You can't park on Town streets between 2 and 7 a.m. from mid-November to mid-April to allow for easy snow clearing.

The woman also wants her daughter's - \$100 worth - cancelled because she argues it's 'discriminatory when she has

no choice but to park on the street when she returns from work at 2 a.m."

User rates

While most Town user fees increases increased a modest 2 per cent this year, the cost of a burial permit jumped 100 per cent to \$20 and dog licenses are \$25, a 25 per cent increase.

Town finance staff suggested departments that usually match fee increases to actual costs use a 2 per cent inflationary indexing, but other criteria was used to make changes, like the Town's wish to make canine control program pay its own way with increased licence fees. Almost all Town recreation and parks program fees increase by 2 per cent this year, including swim classes, sports field and park rentals.
