Acton firefighters pried open a door to rescue two food bank volunteers, trapped in the Perth Avenue Foodshare building for 45-minutes on Saturday morning when a door handle jammed.

Halton Hills Fire Chief Bill Cunningham, who checked to see if the call log notation was an April Fool's joke, confirmed the volunteers were trapped when the door jammed.

After trying to get out, the volunteers called for help and the firefighters forced open the door.

Burning chesterfield


