Councillor Jane Fogal said they would miss having Elliott as a one-man chamber of sober second thought and the wisdom he brings to the table.

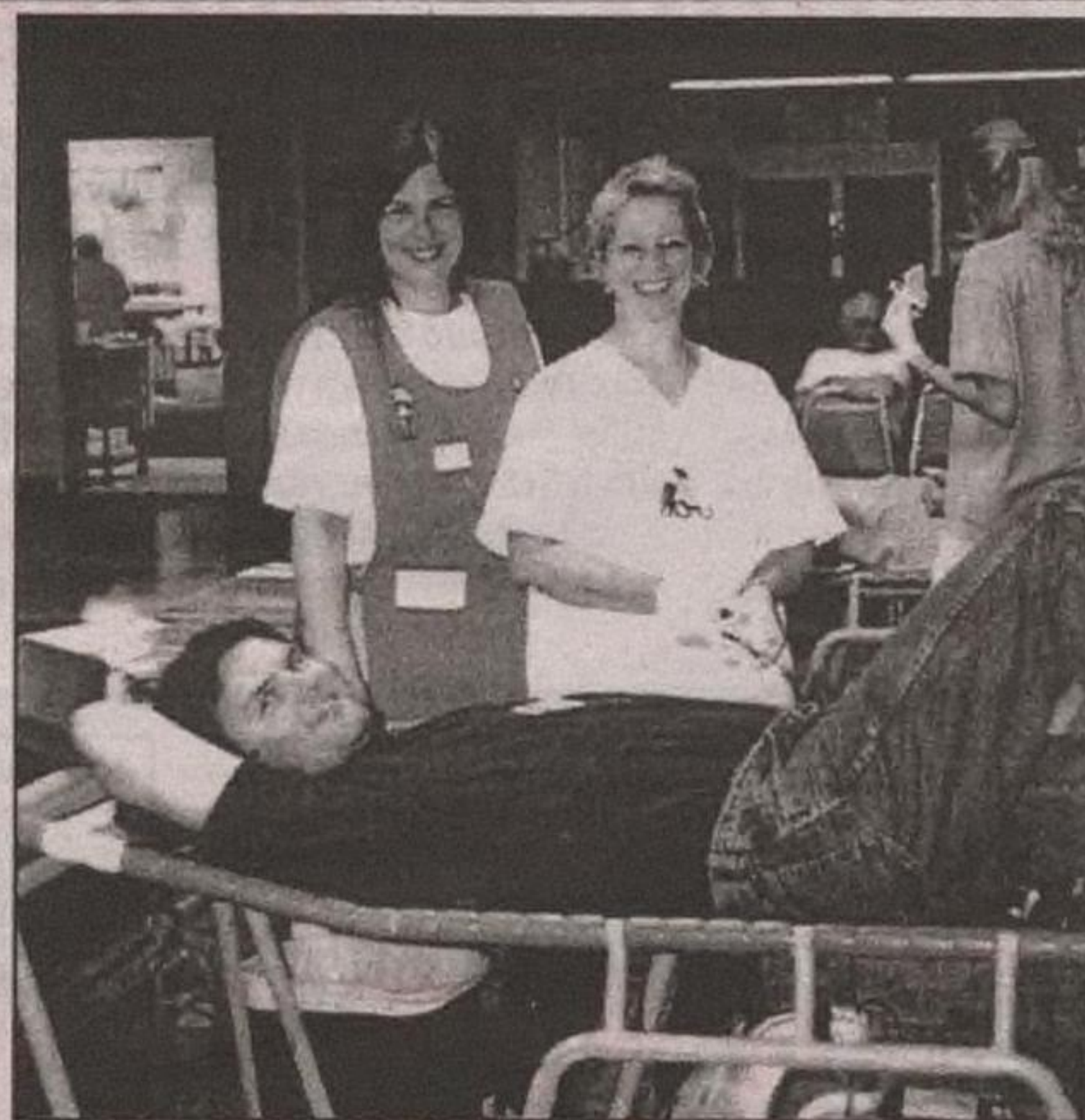

"He just kept on going," Quinn said. "I don't know if he didn't realize he caught the wires or if he didn't care." He did return to speak to police much later in the evening.

Moments later she saw a woman coming along Park Avenue and realized she could well step on those wires without realizing what they were.

"I yelled for Alan and he came flying out and dragged her back away from the danger. She was so startled she said she almost had a heart

attack. But at least she didn't fry," Quinn said. "In fact, once she understood the situation, she thanked Alan for protecting her."

Quinn said police were on the scene within a couple of minutes and Halton Hills Hydro staff arrived 10 to 15 minutes later.

Quinn praised the way the police handled the scene, stopping kids on bikes from getting too close and speaking to neighbours about the situation.

Hydro staff had the damage repaired that evening.

delayed project and said they will report back on the other issues.

When Frizzell exhausted his list of complaints, commission chair Murt Allison assured him the issues would be dealt with.

"You had a bundle this morning. That's good. Let's get it (the required work) off and running," Allison said.

After the meeting, Frizzell said he'd been trying to get some of the jobs done for years and was tired of being

ignored.

"Let's be honest. The job has to be done and if that Glen Williams sub-station goes out, 5,000 people could be without power. They should plan their work," Frizzell said, adding he won't seek a seat on the new hydro board of directors.

"If I don't bring them (the safety concerns) up and something does happen, they'll say, 'Dobbie, why didn't you tell us?' They've been told and now they have to get it fixed."
