## E.coli in one Eden Mills well water safe now in other wells

The water is now safe to drink at the Eden Mills Community Centre, where E. coli bacteria was detected on June 5th, but the Eden Mills Park well is out of service until a \$500 ultraviolet treatment device can be installed.

The burnout of a similar ultraviolet bulb is blamed for allowing E. coli levels to become detectable in well water at the community centre, closed by municipal officials on June 13. The bulb was replaced and levels were undetectable when retested a week later and the well was re-opened on June 13th.

for the results of their last water test.

Evelyn Barton said she puts bleach in the well and has it tested annually and only had high bacteria levels once about three years ago.

Geography and topography can be blamed for poor water quality in the Eden Mills area, according to Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Health Unit program manager Scott Hutchison. He said many people in Eden Mills already have treatment devices on their wells because contamination is more likely in an area with very shallow soil with fractured rock below.

"Everybody is on a septic system in Eden Mills, so the effluent doesn't have a lot of soil to percolate down through before it gets to the fractured bedrock," Hutchison said.

Free bottles for water samples are available at the Wellington/Dufferin/Guelph Health Unit in Guelph and results are available within 72 hours by phone.

## Six arrests for track obstruction

Six Rockwood teens have been charged with Mischief Endangering Life in connection with debris piled on the railroad tracks in Rockwood on May 14.

A pile of railroad ties and tree branches, piled about three feet high on the tracks, damaged a brake and casing on one of the coaches of an eastbound passenger train.

Two hours later another eastbound train was able to stop before striking debris again piled on the tracks.

Wellington OPP are warning residents on the west side of Guelph to be cautious of stray animals after two raccoons were put down apparently suffering from rabies or distemper.

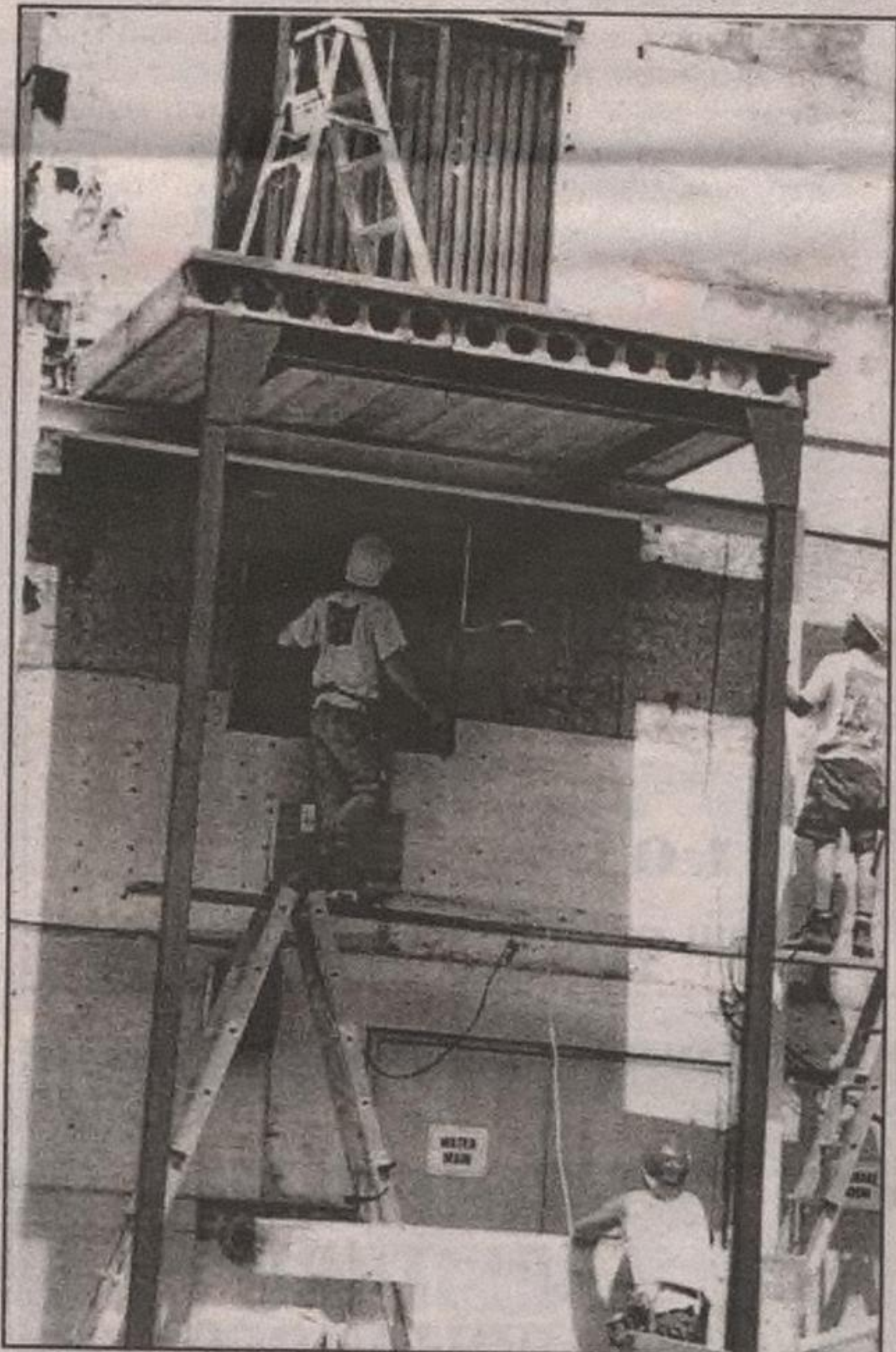

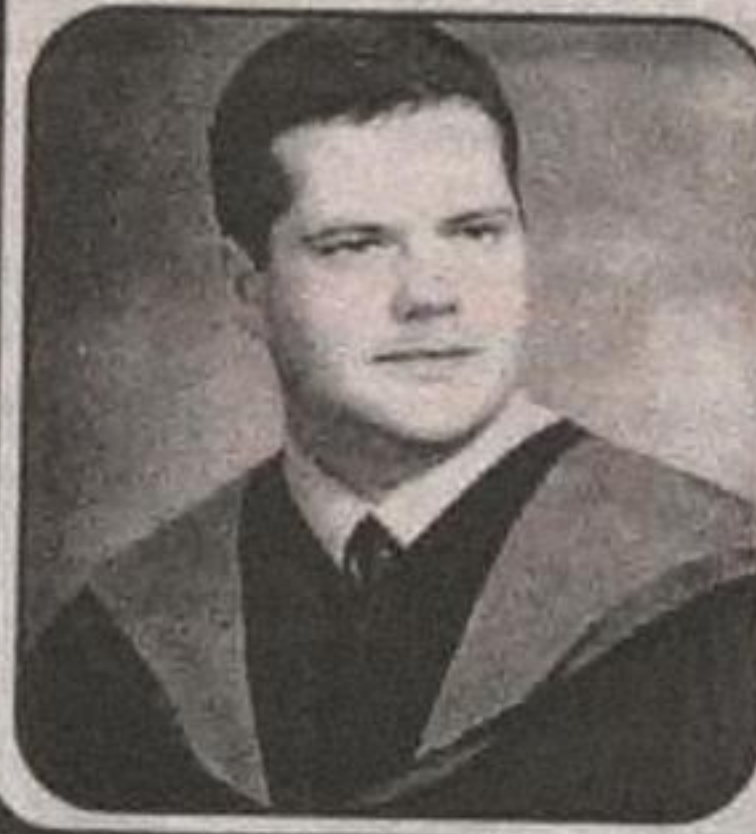
**PROGRESS:** Workmen fit backing preparatory to adding stucco to the exterior of Squire's Lodge in Rockwood.
