The 11-year-old Acton girl is a rookie on the Georgetown Vipers, a house league football team with the Brampton Minor Football Association. She's liked football ever since she was little when she watched it on television with

her dad and is a diehard Green Bay fan.

Holly said she likes being treated like a player, not a girl, during games and practices.

"When the equipment goes on you're a football player, you don't worry about anything. It's play football or get out," Holly said, adding she's had a few minor injuries.

Holly's throwing and catching skills during flag football games in gym class caught the attention of her phys ed. teacher, Steve

Morrison, who is also the Viper's head coach. Morrison told her about the team and she signed up for her first season.

Morrison said Holly's initial timidness on the gridiron disappeared after just a couple of pre-season practices.

"In one of the drills Holly got real aggressive she was tackling and wrapping legs and I really saw a change after just four practices," Morrison said

The Vipers were 0 and 8 on the season - "you can't win 'em all," Coach Morrison said, adding they ended the season on a high note, playing their very best yet against the two toughest teams.


Halton golf course in Georgetown on August 21.
