
## Cats not a health threat

- Mankind's attempts to control and manipulate na-

ture have been disastrous in the past. There are too many endangered species to count. Nature and animal life will survive forever without human presence but will not survive for long on our own.

It seems to make more sense to learn to live harmoniously with other species than to continually fight them. A television documentary, hosted by Lorne Green once told how the bombings on London, England during the war had caused a large postwar stray cat population. The residents of that city provided food for the strays and otherwise let them be. There are universities in the United States that trap cats, vaccinate, spay and neuter them and release them back into the area from which they were taken.

Isn't it peculiar that here we catch them, lock them up, and if no one will adopt them (for a price, of course) put them to death?



### Credit Card Crime

Always report the loss or then of a credit card immediately. You are often held responsible for any use of the credit card until you report it stolen to the credit card company or bank, Also report it to the police.

Keep an up to date list of all your credit cards and the numbers and expiry dates.

If you receive calls indicating you have won a prize or are eligible for a free gift, DO NOT give them your credit card number.

If you utilize public type lockers, such as at a swimming pool, do not leave credit cards or other valuables in the locker, even if it has a lock.

Do not leave credit cards in a vehicle - they are easily stolen from the glove box.

Put your signature on new cards immediately.

If you lend someone your credit card, you may get a big bill.

Before you put your credit card receipt in you pocket. check it carefully. Make sure it is correct. If there is carbon paper, take it and destroy it.

When you get your card back, make sure it is yours. A good scam is to hand you back someone else's card. then run up your bill.

By being careful with your credit card, you remove the opportunity for the thief.
