quest to hire a consultant for an un-budgeted study.

Bonnette suggested the work be done in-house, but was told staff has a long list of higher priority items to deal with first.

Acton Councillor Norm Elliott is unhappy that any legislation would include a grandfather clause, allowing people who park large vehicles in their driveway before

the bylaw is passed, to continue doing so, as a non-conforming land use.

... I support the idea (of a bylaw) 100 per cent. I just reiterate, it will not resolve the existing problems that are out where neighbours are thinking if this bylaw is passed, goodie, goodie, the trailer is moved next door. It won't happen," Elliott said, adding he raised the same issue five years ago.

After being cautioned about adding items into an already tight capital budget, councillors voted to send the request for \$15,00 to hire a consultant to write a bylaw to next year's budget deliberations.
