Senior Awards

Council was pleased to recognize Mrs. Mandy Kirk as one of 20 people in Ontario to receive 2000 Senior Achievement Awards. Mrs. Kirk, who is in her 92<sup>nd</sup> year, has been a volunteer at Allendale for 14 years and this spring received the first ever award for 5,000 hours of devotion to Allendale clients.

Healthy Community Fund The third year allocation decisions of the Healthy Community Fund (HCF) were ratified by Regional Council. The 2000 HCF totals \$376,191 and includes the Region's contribution of \$276,691, as well as \$18,500 carried forward from 1999 and an additional \$81,000 leveraged from the 12 HCF partners. The majority of proposals (60 per cent) involved project with a regionwide impact, with the remainder targetting specific municipalities or neighbourhoods. When both the sponsoring and participating partners are counted, over 200 partners were involved in the 48 proposals. Although the funds are allocated in 2000, most of the project implementation will take place in 2001.

**Needle Exchange** In response to a need identified in the community, Regional Council approved the establishment of a needle exchange program. Staff advised that needle exchange programs have proven effective in reducing the transmission of HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis B and Hepatitis C. Statistics show they are particularly effective in communities like Halton where drug use is low and rapid disease transmission has not yet occurred. Council approved a budget of \$40,000 to be allocated to this project.

data obtained from clients. community participation host agencies, private sector employers and staff involved with the Ontario Works -Halton program. Moving into its fourth year of operation, Ontario Works - Halton has received favourable ratings from all of the stakeholders regarding its delivery. The program, with its various components, was seen by those surveyed as expanding the number of options available to participants and making a difference for both the participants and the community.

> Water Quality Improvement

Regional council approved pre-design work for ozonation treatment at the Burlington and Oakville water Purification Plants. Staff advised Council that they had evaluated a number of technologies to deal with persistent taste and odour problems experienced in the water supply from the lake-based conventional water treatment plants during late summer and fall in the past few years. In addition, while current MOE standards are being met and exceeded, Council was advised that treatment upgrades for disinfection are war-

ranted. As a result of their evaluation, staff recommended ozonation as the best method for providing both effective disinfection as well as improved aesthetics. i.e. taste, odour and appear-

Regional Official Plan Council endorsed the work program for a review of Halton Region's Official plan (ROP) required by the Planning Act. Under the Act, Council must hold a special meeting, open to the public, by the end of November to determine whether there is a need for a revision of the plan.




