Two teens hailed as heroes in near drowning at Rockwwod

Two teenage summer camp councillors are being hailed as heroes by police after saving a 32-year-old woman and her young son from drowning at Rockwood Conservation Area on Saturday afternoon.

Brennan Goman, 19, of Fergus and Kirsten Emrich of Waterloo - head lifeguard at Camp Edgewood in Eden Mills - rescued Phan Vi Du after she floundered while trying to bring her children closer to shore in the popular unsupervised swimming area.

OPP spokesman Daryl Campbell said Du was unconscious and had been under the water for three minutes before Goman found her on the murky bottom and

brought her to shore. She came to and was taken to Guelph General Hospital, treated and released.

Emrich saved the drowning boy, believed to be about eight-year-old, who wouldn't leave his mother. An unidentified woman brought Du's

daughter, believed to be 10years-old, safely to shore. The husband and father watched the rescue efforts from the beach.

Police said Emrich and Goman don't think they're heroes – but they are.

New wells sought for Rockwood

Although no problems have showed up to date in Rockwood's water supply after the train derailment in July. Township officials are setting preventative measures in place for the future problems.

An engineer's report to

Guelph/Eramosa Township council shows none of the diesel fuel that leaked during the derailment has migrated into the town's well water. But no one is taking any chances. The monitoring, paid for by Canadian National Railways, will continue.

Meanwhile, council has asked their consulting engineers. Burnside Associates. to look into locating a new well field for the village.

Right now Rockwood draws all its water from a well on Station Street. That supply appears to still be safe. but council wants a new well located at a completely different site for the future.

"We have our water now." says Guelph/Eramosa Mayor David Adsett, "but the village is growing. Besides the need for an increased water supply for the future, it would be good to have that supply from a totally different area so future problems - such as the derailment - wouldn't catch us without an alternative water source."

No one expects a well to be drilled soon, but they can at least find the site for it in preparation for the time when it is needed.
