source of the call to a small section of Brampton, then narrowed it to the exact house.

The cost for emergency officials responding to the calls could be between \$20,000 and \$30,000, police said.

Police point out that prank calls can be traced even if the caller uses a cell phone. Making harassing calls or prank 911 calls is a criminal offence and if a life is endangered, the caller could also be charged with mischief endangering life.

Police deny any intention of charging the girl's parents under the new Parental Responsibility Act. They have spoken to the girl and her family and found her to be crying, upset and remorseful.

Teachers vote strike...

chair of the board's bargaining unit, Michael Ellis, said he didn't find the overwhelming strike vote surprising.

"There's a lot of unrest around the province not just in the Halton area," Ellis said on Friday, adding the unrest is more or less aimed at the province, not the boards of education.

Ellis said the board feels "caught in the middle" between the teachers and the province and frustrated that the province hasn't given it a

"full deck of cards" to play with.

"I'm wondering what they're expecting from this, not just in Halton, but across the province. Are they expecting province-wide walk-outs, or are they going to step in at the last second. Come up with a deal and take the credit?" Ellis wondered.

Ellis said the Halton Board has no contingency plans "at this time" if teachers strike or stage work-to-rule campaigns as the school year begins September 5.

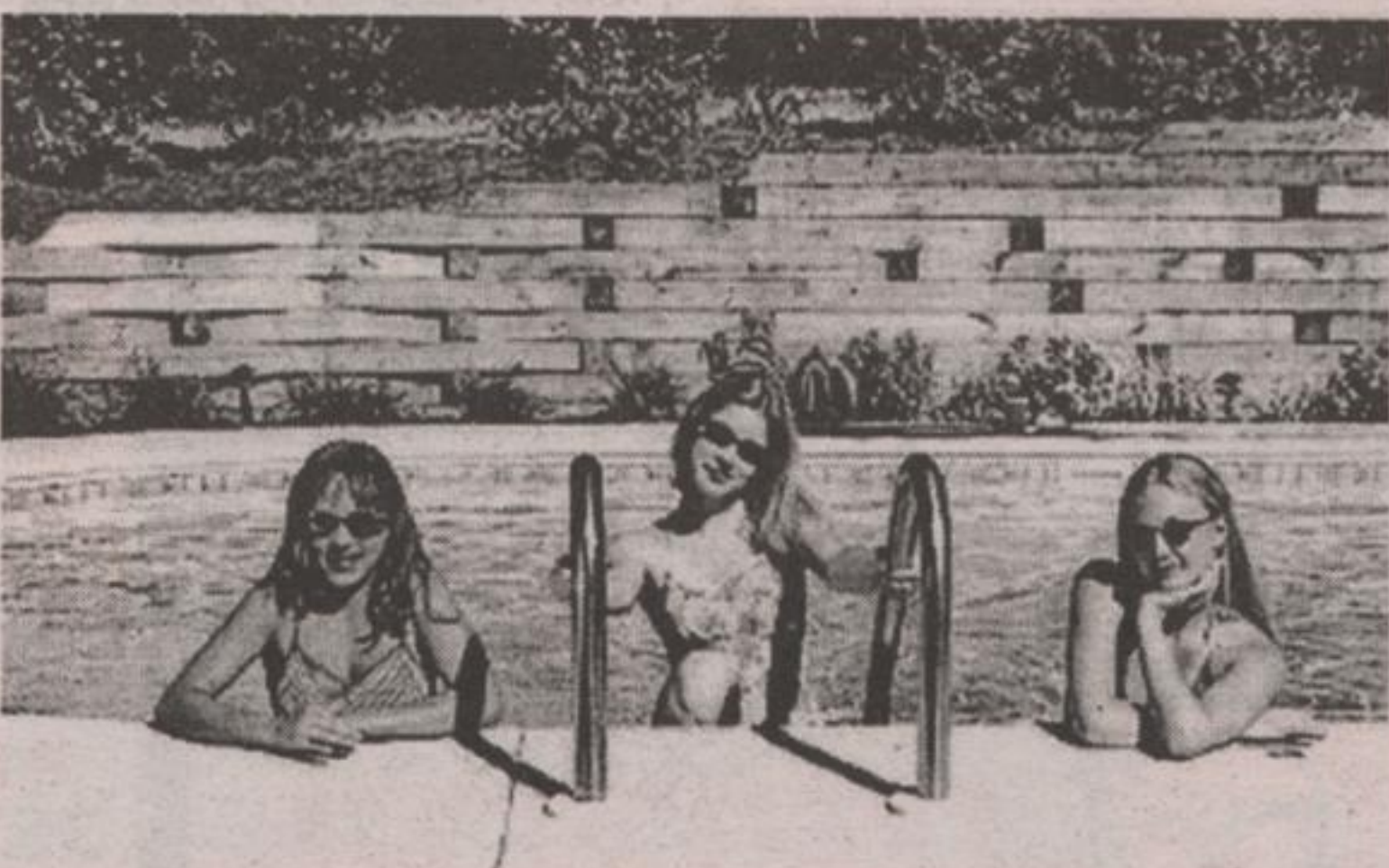


OUTDOOR PARTIES
At this time of year people are having parties at the pool or the patio or the backyard. If they use common sense they will not disturb their neighbours. But too often common sense and alcohol do not mix and neighbourhood problems erupt, resulting in the police being called.

Police are empowered to use the Town of Halton Hills Noise By-Law #93-177 which provides protection for the inhabitants of a residence against any unusual noise or noises likely to disturb them.

This by-law states that the noise must disturb the INHABITANTS, this means that the inhabitants must be prepared to give evidence in court that they were disturbed if police are to lay charges.

Please note: the maximum fine for this by-law is \$5000, which makes it an expensive party.
