A Toronto native, he practised with a partner in Brantford the first year after graduating, then moved to Acton in 1970.

"I always felt more comfortable west of Toronto than east of it," he says in explaining his decision to settle in a small town. The town and indeed the whole area has changed markedly over the years. But it's still a small, friendly community where he didn't face problems - like AIDS and HIV infection - which some of his colleagues faced in larger centres.

His first office was where Dr. Thompson now has his office, on Main Street South. He was there when he experienced one of the funnier moments in his business. His very first customer came in while he was still unpacking. The man needed a tooth extracted and Dr. Steen had to set him on a box for the procedure because he didn't have a chair yet. He also had to go rooting through his belongings to find his foreceps and needles to do the job.


Another of his lighter moments relates to a patient who warned him he always fainted when he had a tooth pulled. Dr. Steen said he had no problem with that. He just charged double when patients fainted. Apparently it worked because he did the work and the man didn't faint.

In 1975 he joined forces with a group of other doctors to build the Acton Medical Centre at the corner of Mill and Frederick streets.

The Steens lived in Acton briefly, then lived in Limehouse for many years. Recently Dr. Steen and his wife Christina, a lab technician at his office for 25 years, built a new home in Collingwood and plan to spend their retirement there.



He also wants to do volunteer work with the Multiple Sclerosis Soceity after having a relative and a friend both suffer from the illness.

Dr. Steen says dentists have less trouble selling their practices because dentists don't see the same need to be near big centres.

"We don't get the same sort of emergency calls medical doctors do. Nor do we have the same sort of unpredictable schedules. We can schedule our patients for repeat visits and plan our workload a lot more than they can. There just doesn't seem to be the same problem for us to get a new dentist to replace us when we want to retire," he says.

Dr. Steen has sold his practise to Dr. Julian Lo of Mississauga and will continue to work in Acton part time for another month or two.


