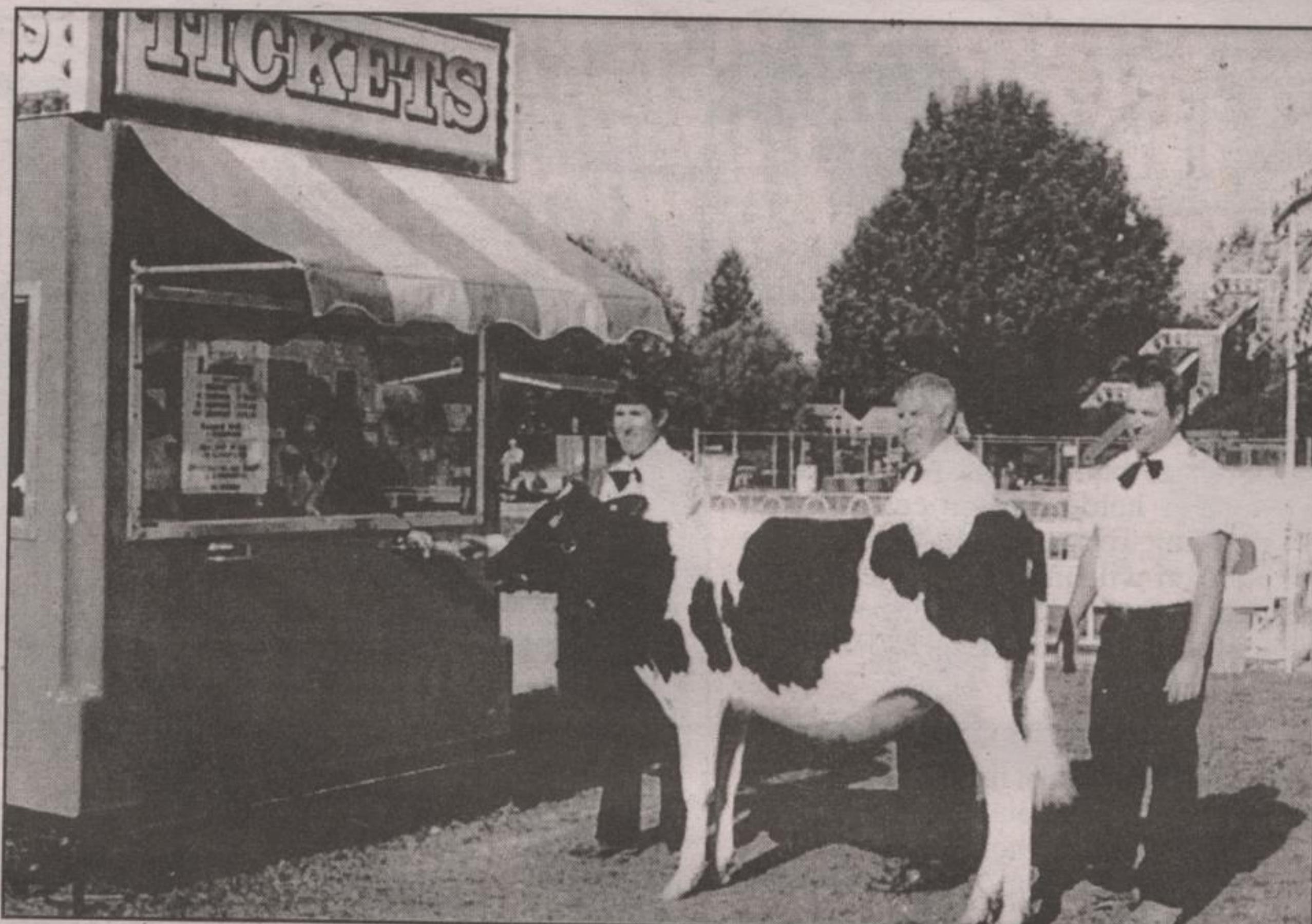

Interim trustees

Halton District School Board has appointed Oakville and Burlington as interim trustees to the Board, filling two vacancies due to resignations.

The two candidates, Kelly Amos of Oakville and Dan Drohan of Burlington were sworn in as the Halton District School Board's newest trustees at the Board meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 20.

These appointments will complete the complement of 10 trustees for the Halton District School Board, effective until the remainder of the current term of office which ends Nov. 30 of this year. There were 30 applicants for the positions.

Kelly Amos will be filling the vacancy left by former trustee Debbie Marklew, in Oakville Wards 5 and 6. Dan Drohan will replace former trustee David Bird in Wards 4, 5 and 6 in Burlington.

Truck ban petition

Corporate co-operation isn't good enough any more for some Fourth Line residents with on-going gravel truck safety problems - they want increased police enforcement.

Esquering Rural Watch spokesman Geoff Knuff presented a 100-name petition to the Town last week, asking for a heavy truck ban on the Fourth Line south of Side Road and on 10 Side Road.

Knuff said Blue Circle Aggregates has historically been a good corporate neighbour, but the growing demand for gravel has raised problems with the number of trucks, speeding and overloading to an "epidemic" level.

Knuff suggested heavy truck traffic should be re-

routed to Regional Roads that have a wider tax support base to pay for maintenance.

Staff will bring back a report on the process that must be followed for Council to ban trucks on a road.

401 financing help?

There may be some financial help for 15 small landowners in the Town's 401-Steeles Avenue area who face a \$18,250-per-acre charge - paid up front or spread over 10 years - to bring water and sewer services to their land, now zoned as a prestige industrial area.

There are 130 landowners in the area and Halton Hills councillors asked the Region for some financial help for those with small lots and hobby farms who can't afford the special levy for the im-

LOST YOUR WALLET OR PURSE

Many times over the year I receive calls from citizens who have lost a wallet or purse. This usually includes all their identification, credit cards and bank cards, plus cash and other items we all keep. For a police officer to take this type of report and place the lost or stolen items on the police computer, the credit card numbers and date of expiry, numbers from the identification documents are required, and usually people cannot remember these numbers. A simple solution to this is to photocopy all the documents and to keep the photo copy in a safe place until needed.

Another good thing to do is to photograph any household valuables, such as Royal Dalton, silverware, jewellery, or anything that might be subject of an insurance claim, or for descriptive purposes for police for police. Also take a photo of the serial numbers or at least write them down, of all electronic items in your house, such as the computer, the VCR, and T.V. etc. Place a copy of these photographs and lists in a safe place, and it's sometimes good to make a second copy and put it in a safe deposit box. If you need to engrave your name on anything contact me at 853-2050 and I will loan you an engraver. People are forever losing their keys, I know, I get several sets dropped off at the station every month. Check your keys right now, is their anyway someone can identify you, your home or your vehicle from the keys, if they can, remove the identification, it could be used to steal your car, or get into your home.
