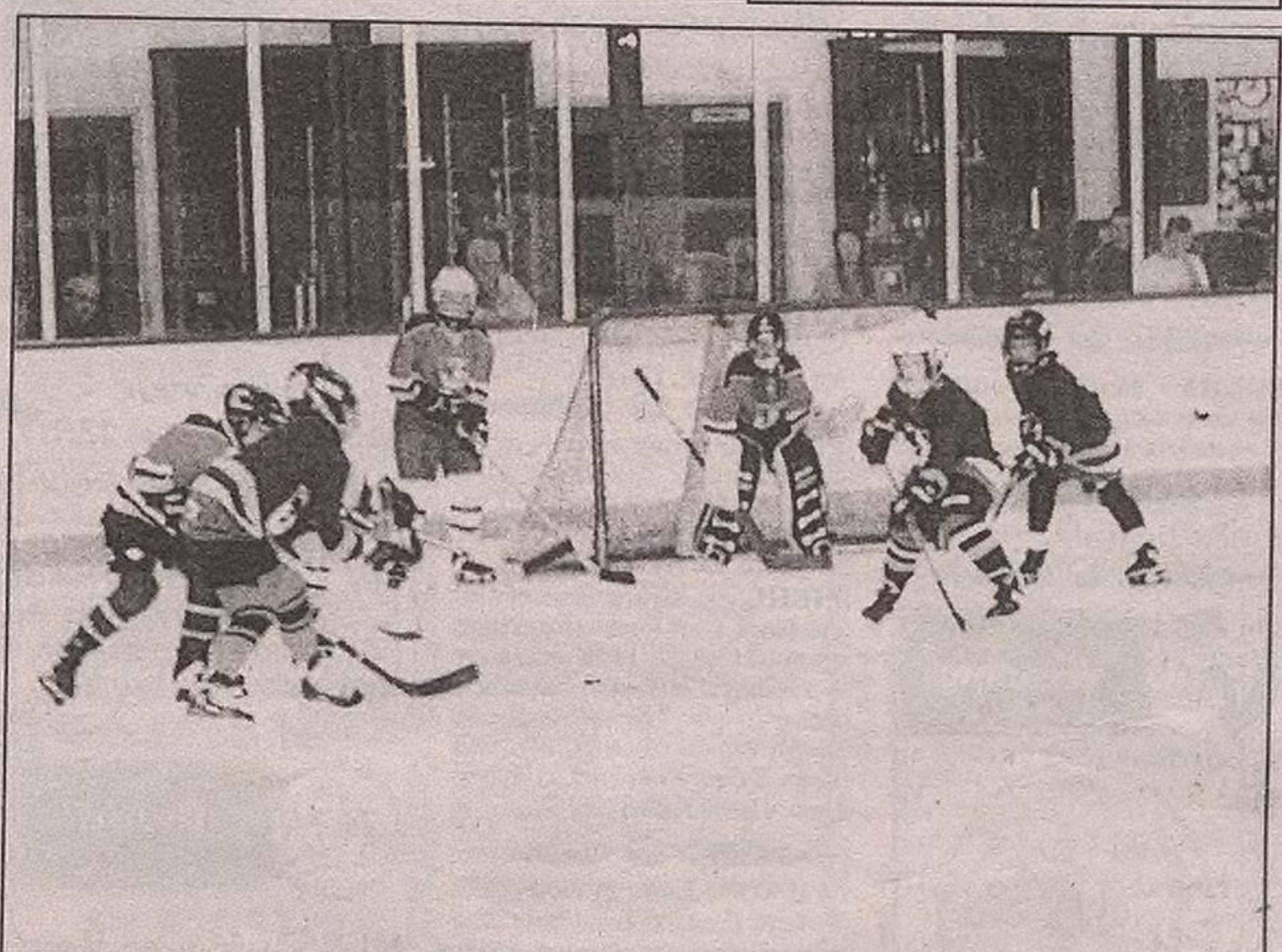

Despite a second undefeated week in Harrison Division play, Acton's Minor Bantam Tanners were up early Sunday morning for a tough skating practice, followed by dry-land training. Ancaster made it close with their second power-play goal with 1:30 seconds on the clock. Jordan Guindon, bothered recently by a sore neck, returned to action with some sparkling saves at key moments, including a short-handed breakaway. Aaron Chiasson led Acton with two goals and five points. Matt Bronziewski had two goals and four points, including completing a pretty two on one with Mark Boycott. Boycott's strong forward play finally was rewarded, with the winning marker and three points. Smooth-skating Chad Artem led the defence with fine play in his own end.

The Tanners face Elora at home and play in Guelph this week as they continue to prepare for the Silver Stick Tournament in Collingwood at month's end.
