tried to break up a fight between the woman and another female "combatant."

At 3:52 on Friday afternoon, the officer saw two women fighting on the front lawn of a Victoria Avenue house. After identifying himself as an officer he arrested and handcuffed one of the women who spit in his face.

The assault charge relates to the spitting, neither of the women pressed charges against the other for what police called a "consensual fight."

House fire

A fire of unknown origin that began in a second floor master bedroom caused an estimated \$60,000 damage to a Greenore Crescent home at 4:46 on Saturday afternoon.

The homeowners told investigators that when they opened the front door after being out for four-and-a-half hours, they found their house filled with smoke and extreme heat.

Firefighters found the blaze had burned itself because of a lack of oxygen, but not before causing extensive smoke and heat damage to second floor bedrooms and washroom, and light smoke damage to the main floor. The source of ignition and cause are undetermined.

CO alarm

Acton firefighters found no evidence of a carbon monoxide leak after being called to a house on 15 Side Road, west of Highway 25, at 3:32 a.m. on Friday.

The detector indicated that the battery was low and after the homeowner put in a fresh one, the detector went into alarm and he called the fire department who found the alarm had malfunctioned.

Davidson and Fourth Line wells, from the week of September 10th, showed levels of "zero, zero, zero one and two."

"What it's (the test results) are telling us - the bottom line is there's probably some surface water moving very quickly to the Davidson and Fourth Line Wells," Holysh said.

Both wells, the 50-foot-deep Davidson on Churchill Road North and the 150-foot deep Fourth Line well, located north of Highway 7, are limestone bedrock wells, allowing

for less filtering through the overburden Holysh said.

Holysh suspects the bacteria contaminating the raw water at both wells could be from "local farm practices, and maybe septic systems."

There have not been any unacceptable treated water test results at the Prospect Park well where a green sand filter removes iron and manganese from the water that is

chlorinated.

"We're quite comfortable that our chlorination system and back-ups are working properly and the drinking water in Acton is safe. We've been aware of the (Davidson and Fourth Line) problem for a while and haven't considered it to be that super serious - the finished water has always tested well," Holysh said.

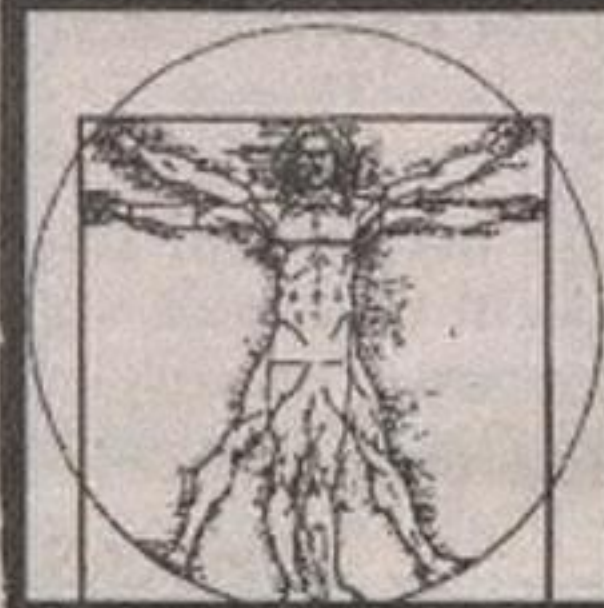

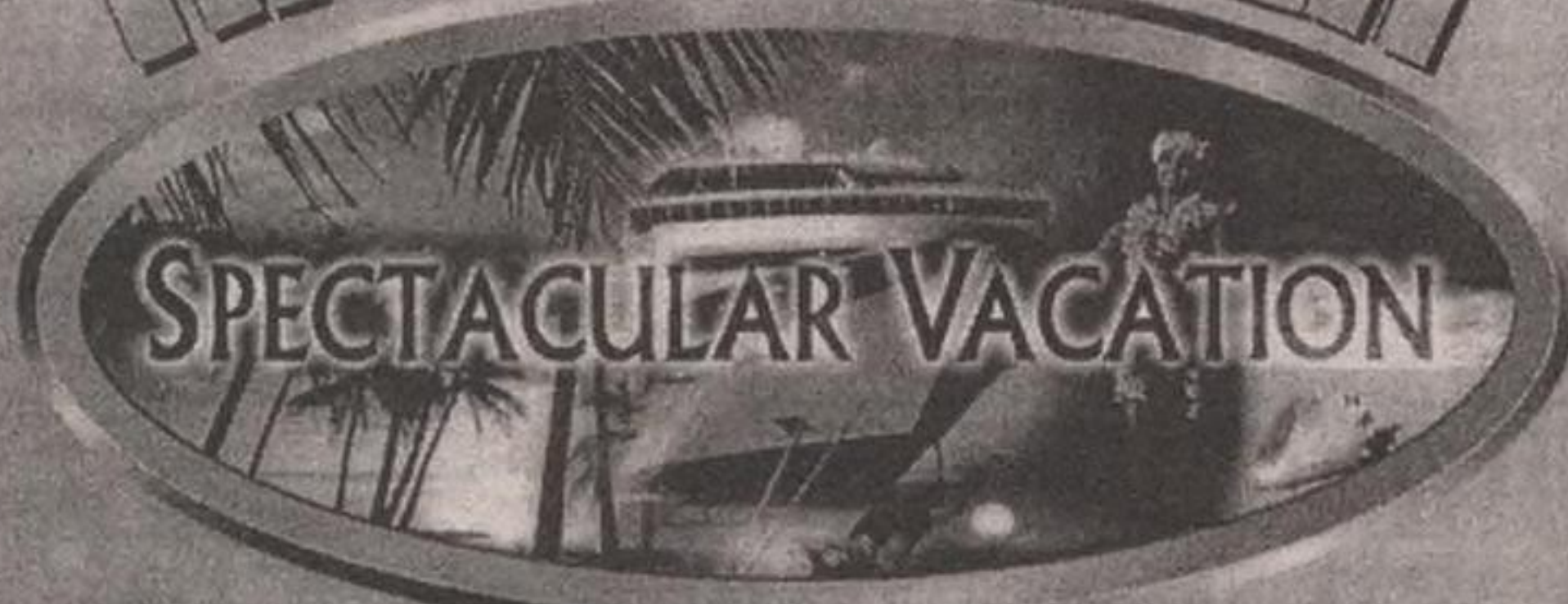
