Just when Acton voters thought they had the municipal election candidates straight, there's a whole new slate of federal candidates to get to know.

Some 20 million Canadians - including 81,256 in Halton, known as a swing riding - are eligible to vote in Canada's 37th general election on November 27.

In the last federal election,

Halton returned Liberal Julian Reed of Norval, to a second term with 47 per cent of the popular vote.

Reed, an actor, former MPP and renewable energy advocate, won the seat from one-term Tory MP Garth Turner in 1993.
