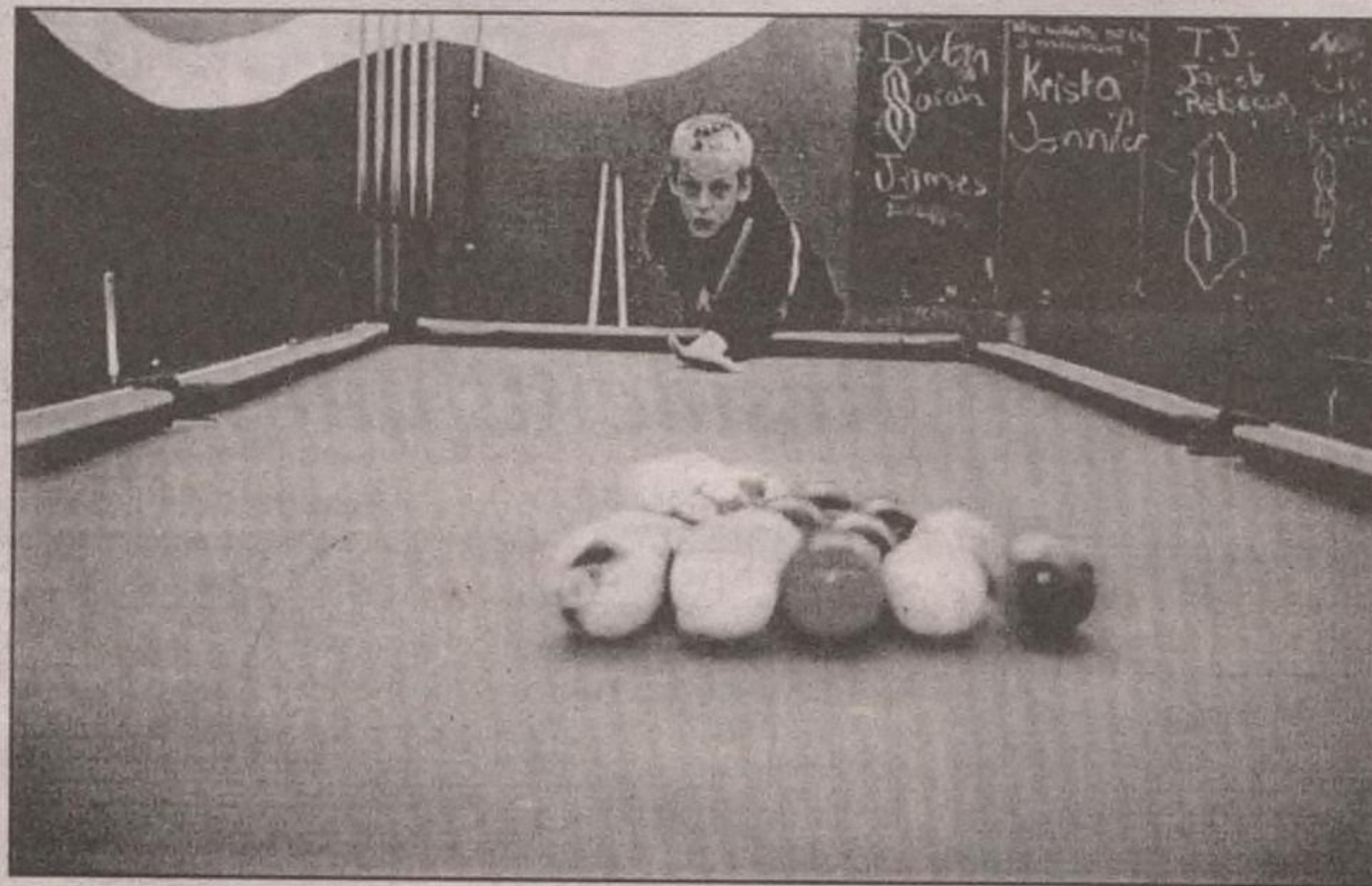

**TAKE YOUR TICKET AND BE HAPPY THAT YOUR CAR IS STILL THERE.**

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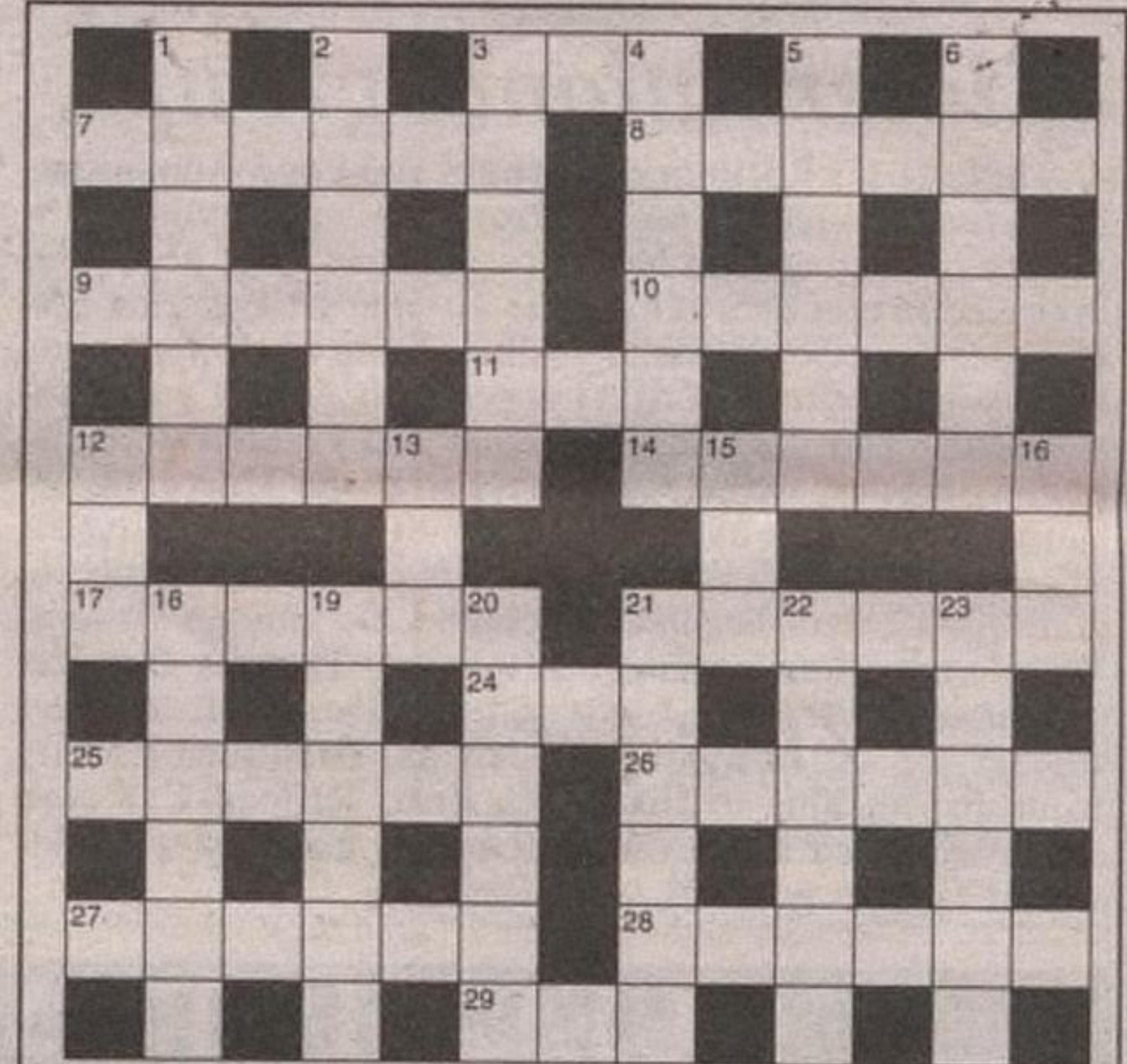
