## Hunting check station operating

The Aurora District Office of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Halton Sportsmen's Association volunteers will operate a wildlife check station Nov. 6 to 10.

The station will operate at the Association's headquarters on Steeles Avenue between Bell School Line and Appleby Line, west of Milton. Volunteers and MNR staff will check deer harvested in Wildlife Management Units 79C and 79D during Halton's controlled deer hunt, Nov. 6 to 10.

The station will be open Monday to Thursday from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. and from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Friday.Rob Messervey, MNR's Auroa District Manager, asks hunters to bring their deer to the station "so that we may collect biological information on the animals. This information will help us monitor the health of the whitetail deer herds in Halton Region."

During the controlled deer hunt in Halton Region, hunters with tags for WMUs 79C and 79D may hunt deer with a shotgun or a muzzle-loading gun in all of the Halton Regional Forests except the Coulson Tract. Hunters need permission from landowners before hunting on private property. They should also check with local municipal offices for details of municipal bylaws regulating the discharge of firearms.

No hunting is permitted on Credit Valley or Halton Region Conservation authority lands.


