

Acton downs Raiders 5-1

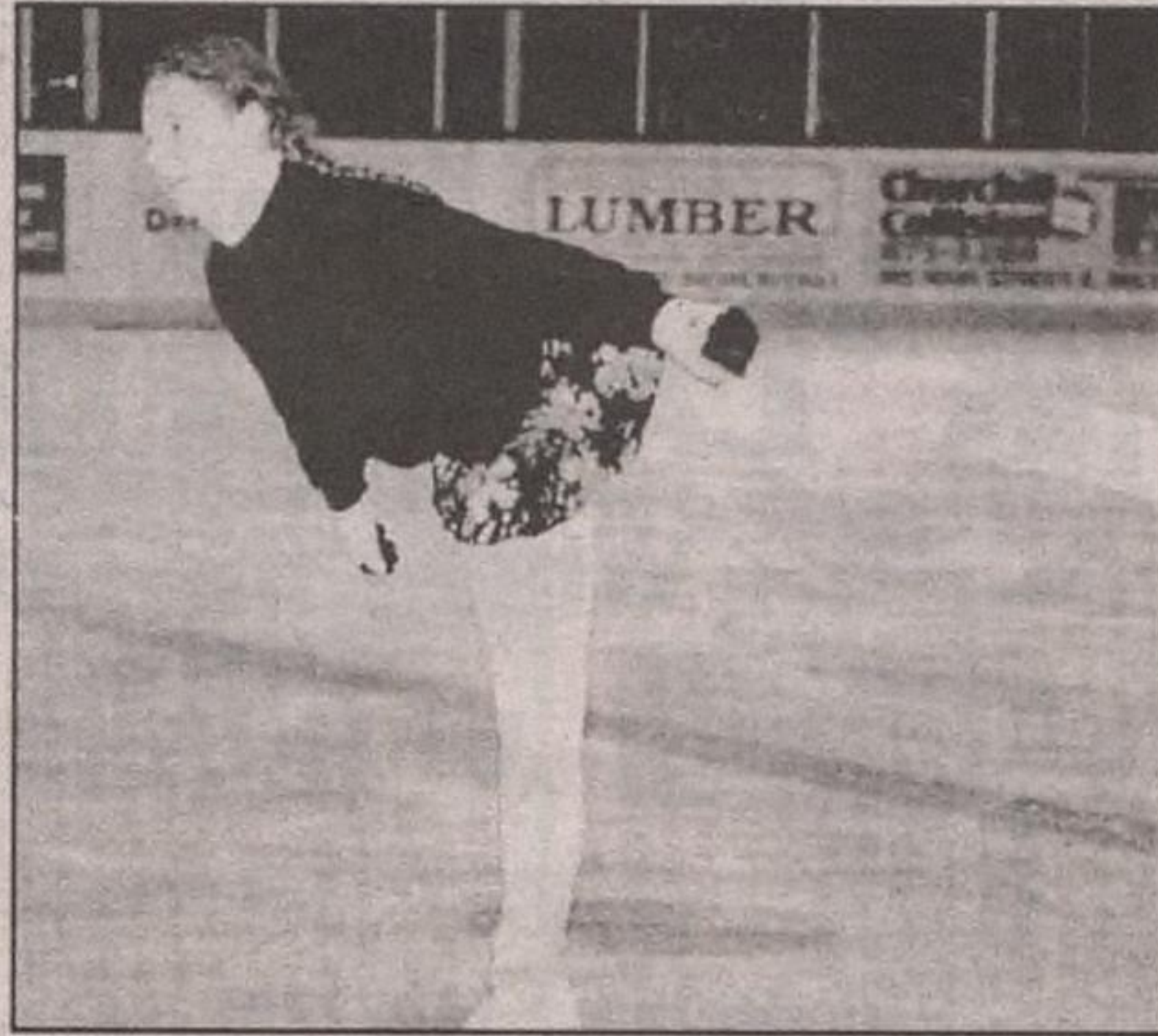

Not surprisingly, the Tanner Minor Bantams were low on energy as they returned home last week to face Georgetown, following their Silver Medal effort in Collingwood. In their first meeting, Acton easily prevailed 5-1, outplaying the Raiders by an even wider margin. But a different Georgetown team hit the Acton ice Tuesday night. Playing with a high level of energy and commitment, they forced Acton into a lot of unproductive dump-and-chase hockey. The Tanners opened the scoring, but were having trouble spotting the open man, and were unable to turn a lot of good offensive zone possession into solid scoring chances. Georgetown's goalie made some spectacular saves on the few well-placed shots the Tanners created. At the other end, the raiders twice caught the Acton team flowing up ice and buried both breakaway chances with pretty plays, the

second with nine seconds left in the game, to steal a 2-1 win.

On Saturday, the tanners were again at home to Fergus and came out with a 2-2 tie as 26 minor penalties totaling 52 minutes (of a 40 minute game) completely removed any pattern to the game. In a contest not at all chippy by this season's Harrison Division standards, Fergus was assessed 12 minor penalties to Acton's 14. Unlike their Tuesday effort, the Tanners badly outchanced Fergus, but hit the iron several times and the quality of many of their shots failed to tax the Fergus netminder.

On an upbeat theme, the Tanners have announced plans for a four-game, 10-day tour of the Czech Republic (home of the Hockey News' world's best player Jaromir Jagr), Austria and Germany. The trip takes place in the March break and fundraising is well under way under the capable direction of Manager Bob Collins, for what promises to be the trip of a lifetime. ***
