A small group of Acton businesses have come up with a way to reward hard work and positive behaviour by local pupils. They'll treat them to a free bowling party.

Gord Labombard, co-owner of Acton Bowling Lanes, says the group has approached principals in Acton's elementary schools and invited them to nominate one class each month based on their positive attitude and good behaviour. Teachers will nominate their classes and principals will make the pick in individual schools. Then a committee from the sponsoring businesses will make the final selection from each month's nominees.

Labombard says Godfather's is providing pizza to the winning class and the IGA is supplying the drinks. So far Power Entertainment and Acton Musicland are providing prizes for hidden scores but other merchants have also been approached to join the effort.

"We're looking for a way to support those good, positive kids," Labombard said.

While the program may be unique at present, other communities are watching their effort, Labombard says. If it works in Acton it's very likely it will be copied elsewhere as merchants seek ways to encourage appropriate behaviour in young people in their community.
