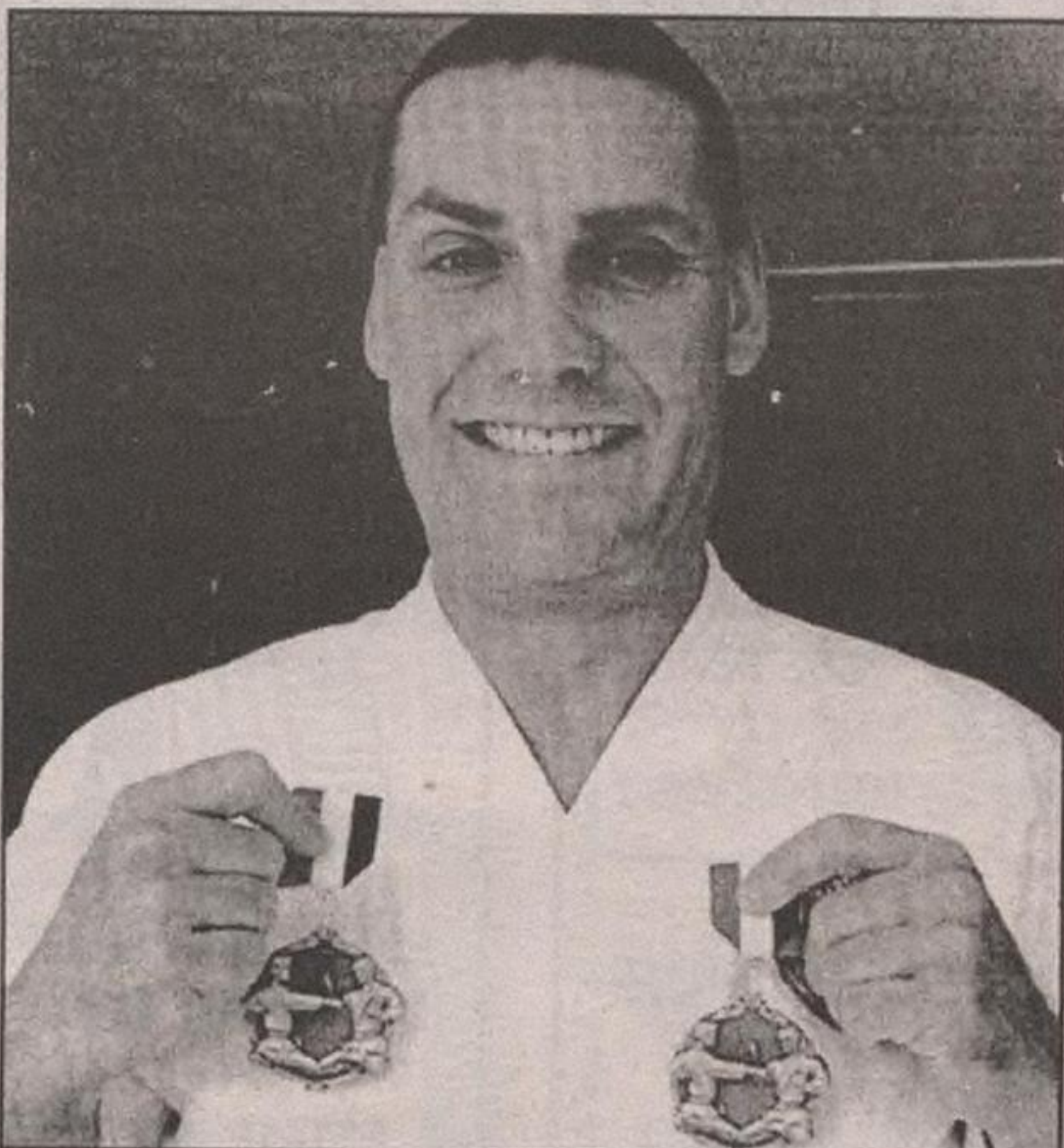
Novices win three
