

## Profile of Halton riding candidates

Prior to the municipal election, Halton MP Julian Reed predicted the heavy advance polling meant the voters wanted a change at the top and he was right.

Reed, and the four candidates challenging him for his job, will have to wait until November 27 to see if the political axiom translates to federal politics.

Halton, the third most prosperous riding in Ontario, is known as a swing riding where voters mirror the national vote. It is a rapidly growing riding that includes all of Halton Hills and the northern portions of Oakville and Burlington and has been held by Reed for two terms.
