Basinger is president of the Upper Credit Hedgehog Club, a informal collection of

more closely related to moles and shrews.

Basinger started the club trade ideas and information with some of the people who were buying baby hedgehogs from her business -Hodgepig Hedgehogs. Business is booming, Basinger has orders for hedgehogs not yet born.

Hedgehogs fetch between \$90 and \$150 depending on their colour and if they come with a starter kit that includes food, bedding and follow-up advice. In the seven years Basinger and her family have been breeding hedgehogs, she's sold between 300 and 400.

"At one point we had 20 breeding adults - that was too much work and we keep them in the house and there wasn't enough room, but it was at the time of the biggest
