Acton started playing the third seed team of Chatham, and lost 46-20. Scoring for Acton were Ruth Eddolls and Chrissy Pereira two points, Holly Goddard and Meghann Williams four points and Sarah Berry eight points.

Next, Acton had to play O'Gorman from Timmins. They had won their first game Acton defeated O'Gorman in a nail biter 40-39. Scoring for Acton were Meighan McIntyre and Laura Anne Sheehan two points, Sarah Berry four points, Holly Goddard six points. Chrissy Pereira seven points, Ruth Eddolls nine points and Meghann Williams ten points. This win put Acton into the quarter finals.

Their next opponent was North Middlesex from London. North Middlesex was the number one seed in the tournament and Acton lost 48 to 33. Scoring for Acton were Chrissy Pereira and Holly Goddard four points, Laura Anne Sheehan six points.

The Red Storm's first win of the season was in the second game of the tournament in a match against a much taller Timmins team.

"We determined to play the game between the three point lines and keep their height away from the baskets,' Shepherd said, adding they pressured Timmins like Acton had been pressured all season.

The game was close and Acton tied it when Ruth Eddolls went out with a knee injury in the third quarter. Timmins scored two threepoint shots in a row with about two-and-a -half minutes left, to go ahead by six points.

"Our girls just kept on going and were within one point with 40 seconds left. We do this thing where we aggressively jump the players and a girl panicked and threw the ball and Sarah Berry stole it, went down and laid it in to put us ahead by one for a final of 40-39," Shepherd said.

"Our game plan for the season was to keep improving and these girls played incredibly well," Shepherd said, adding thanks to the Town and the olde Hide House, the team was able to give municipal pins and leather key chains to the other teams at meet.




