Skills building, having fun and trying to narrow the scoring gap are on the agenda this season for the Acton High School girls' hockey team.

The school iced a team for exhibition play last season a mix of rep hockey players, figure skaters and girls who never held a stick before - and drew 16 players this season.

Coach Bruce Andrews, a retired Acton High School teacher, says this season will be a learning experience.

"Our goal for this year is to improve our skills for the kids who haven't played before. My main focus will be on the kids who haven't played and to try to eventually bring that score down so if we're losing, we're losing at a lower score," Andrews said.

Acton doubled E.C. Drury 4-2 to open the season, but then lost 6-0 at home to T.A. Blakelock and 6-1 to White Oaks in Oakville.

First year player Gillian Brunelle scored Acton's lone goal against White Oaks - set up nicely by Krista Kearns.

Andrews said he gives a lot of credit to the new, younger players.

"The big thing that they find out is that the game is so fast - and I had to remind them that they were playing against girls who had played 400 or 500 games in their rep hockey

"They know they're outclassed that way, yet they're still trying their very best. They just love hockey," Andrews said, adding girls can now find good competition and good instruction in a girls' league.

"I think more girls are playing because it's new and it's fun. They've always seen boys playing it and girls these days don't have to take a back seat to anybody and if the opportunity is there, they're going to try it."

The team practices two or three times a week at Acton arena under a reciprocal deal between the board of education and Town's recreation department.

The cost was \$100 per player and that was used to buy used goalie equipment, socks and power skating sessions.
