Accident closes highway

Police continue to investigate a two-vehicle accident that put two people in hospital and closed Highway 25 between 10 and 15 Side Road at Speyside for three hours on Saturday afternoon.

Relatives report Jarrett Powell, 23, of Georgetown, has improved after being transferred to St. Michael's Hospital from the Milton hospital with serious injuries. Acton firefighters extracated him from the car which was extensively damaged.

His fiancée's son, Gavin Steeley, 2, of Georgetown, who police report was properly restrained in the back seat, was taken to the Hospital for Sick Children with serious injuries. He has been released and the driver of the second vehicle, William Stewart, 57, of Acton was not hurt.

Police report an independent witness saw Powell's 1999 Chev Cavalier stop at the stop sign on 15 Side Road at Highway 25, and proceed easterly into the intersection, coming

in collision with Stewart's southbound 1988 Chev pickup truck.

It was raining and the road was wet when the accident occurred at 12:40 p.m.
