

# Road closure plan

Ramp entry signs, Emergency Diversion Route (EDR) signs and Priority Signal Timing Plans are now in place as part of Halton Region's Road Closure Action Plan (RCAP). The RCAP program was launched in March 2000 to handle traffic control in the event of an emergency road closure along the QEW.

The project involves Halton Region and the four area municipalities (Oakville, Burlington, Milton, and Halton Hills), Halton Region Ambulance Services, Halton Regional Police Service, O.P.P. Ministry of Transportation and area municipal fire departments.

ing. Agency fundraising and donations keep these programs alive. Call Julie Green at 873-6502 for information, tickets a sponsorship package or to donate to our auction.

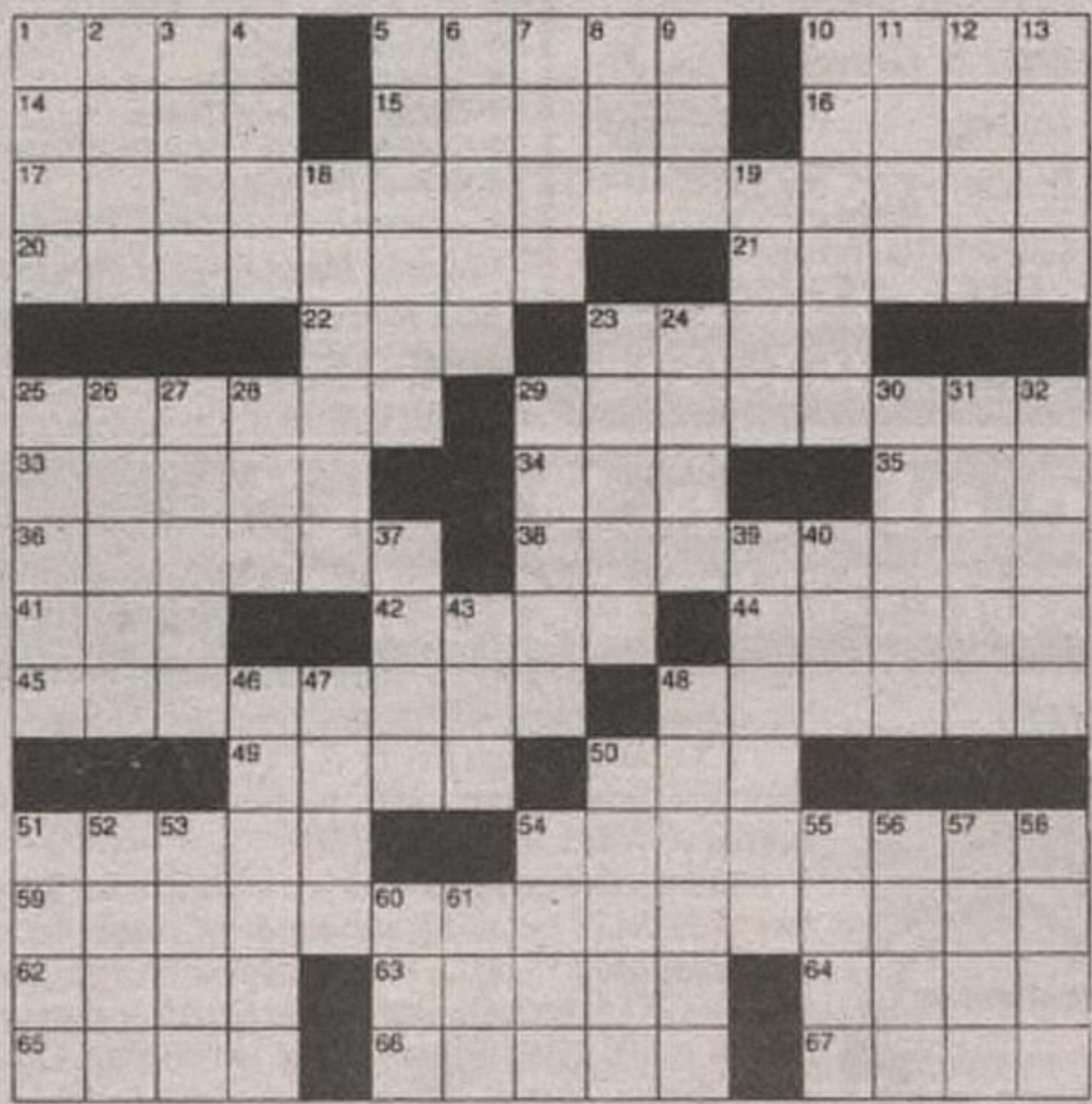
### Say Goodbye to Bill

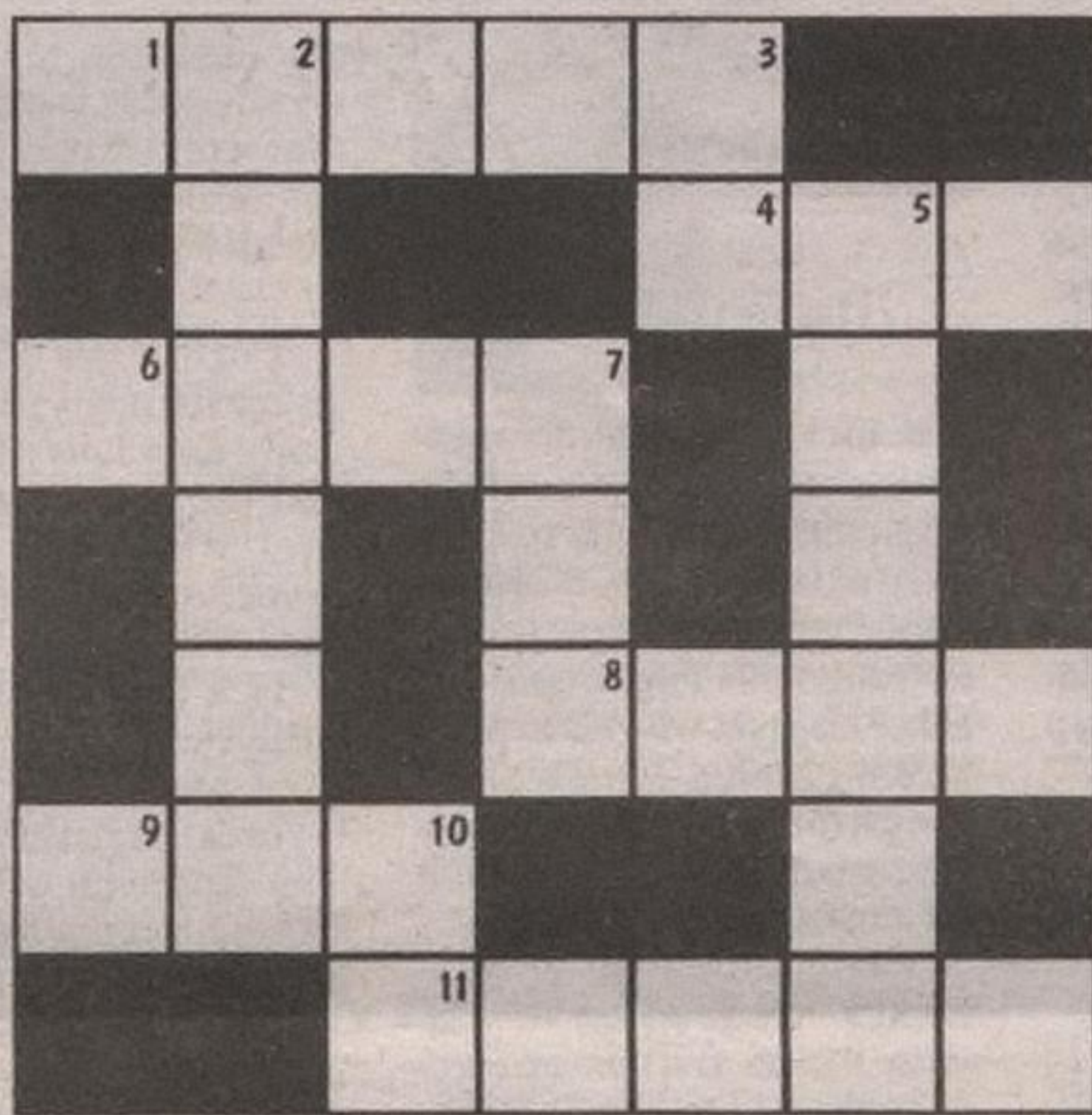
