Four people arrested for fraud

Mississauga man killed north of Acton

A 28-year-old man from Mississauga was killed in a single vehicle crash on County Road 125 (Hwy 25) just north of Acton on the Monday holiday.

Shawn Kempton was attempting to pass a tractor-trailer near the Erin/Halton Town Line about 2 o'clock Monday afternoon when he veered into the east ditch to miss oncoming northbound traffic, Wellington OPP said. Kempton's Chev. Tahoe rolled over several times in the ditch before it came to a stop.

Kempton, driving alone, was rushed to Georgetown Hospital but was pronounced dead upon arrival.

The road was closed for three hours following the accident.

Case may have some international complications

Two residents of 25 Side Road and two residents of Germany have been charged with fraud over \$5,000, possession of and use of forged passports by Halton Region Police, following an incident at a Milton business on Thursday May 17.

Acton girl returned to her dad

Bruce Davitt may have his daughter back, but his legal nightmare is far from over.

Davitt regained custody of Betsy, 11, at a McDonalds in Lansing, Michigan, on Sunday, 11 months after his ex-wife Bonnie Murray, violated an Ontario custody order and refused to return their daughter after a summer visit.

The former couple's cross border tug-of-war ended last week when a U.S. Federal

judge upheld a magistrate's ruling that, under the Hague Convention rules on international child abduction, Betsy must be returned to Canada.

Murray, who has dual citizenship, has moved the fight for custody of their daughter to Canadian soil, filing an ap-

plication in a Milton court. Davitt found the court papers stuffed in his door on Friday night, and his ex-wife gave him another set on Sunday.

At press time, Davitt was waiting to hear from a lawyer, a family law specialist, to find out what to do about the court

papers instructing him to be in a Milton court on Wednesday, (yesterday) to respond to his ex-wife's application.

Davitt is fielding media calls — CFTO TV was at their Kingham Road home on Monday — and trying to help Betsy settle in.

Davitt said, "it's a little different Betsy than when she left," but refused to elaborate. He said he can tell that Betsy is quite happy to be home.

"When she first walked in,
