A 28-year-old man from Mississauga was killed in a single vehicle crash on County Road 125 (Hwy 25) just north of Acton on the Monday holiday.

Shawn Kempton was attempting to pass a tractortrailer near the Erin/Halton Town Line about 2 o'clock Monday afternoon when he veered into the east ditch to miss oncoming northbound traffic, Wellington OPP said. Kempton's Chev. Tahoe rolled over several times in the ditch before it came to a stop.

Kempton, driving alone, was rushed to Georgetown Hospital but was pronounced dead upon arrival.

The road was closed for three hours following the accident.

Davitt regained custody of Betsy, 11, at a McDonalds in Lansing, Michigan, on Sunday, 11 months after his exwife Bonnie Murray, violated an Ontario custody order and refused to return their daughter after a summer visit.

The former couple's cross border tug-of-war ended last week when a U.S. Federal

judge upheld a magistrate's ruling that, under the Hague Convention rules on international child abduction, Betsy must be returned to

Canada. Murray, who has dual citizenship, has moved the fight

for custody of their daughter to Canadian soil, filing an ap-
