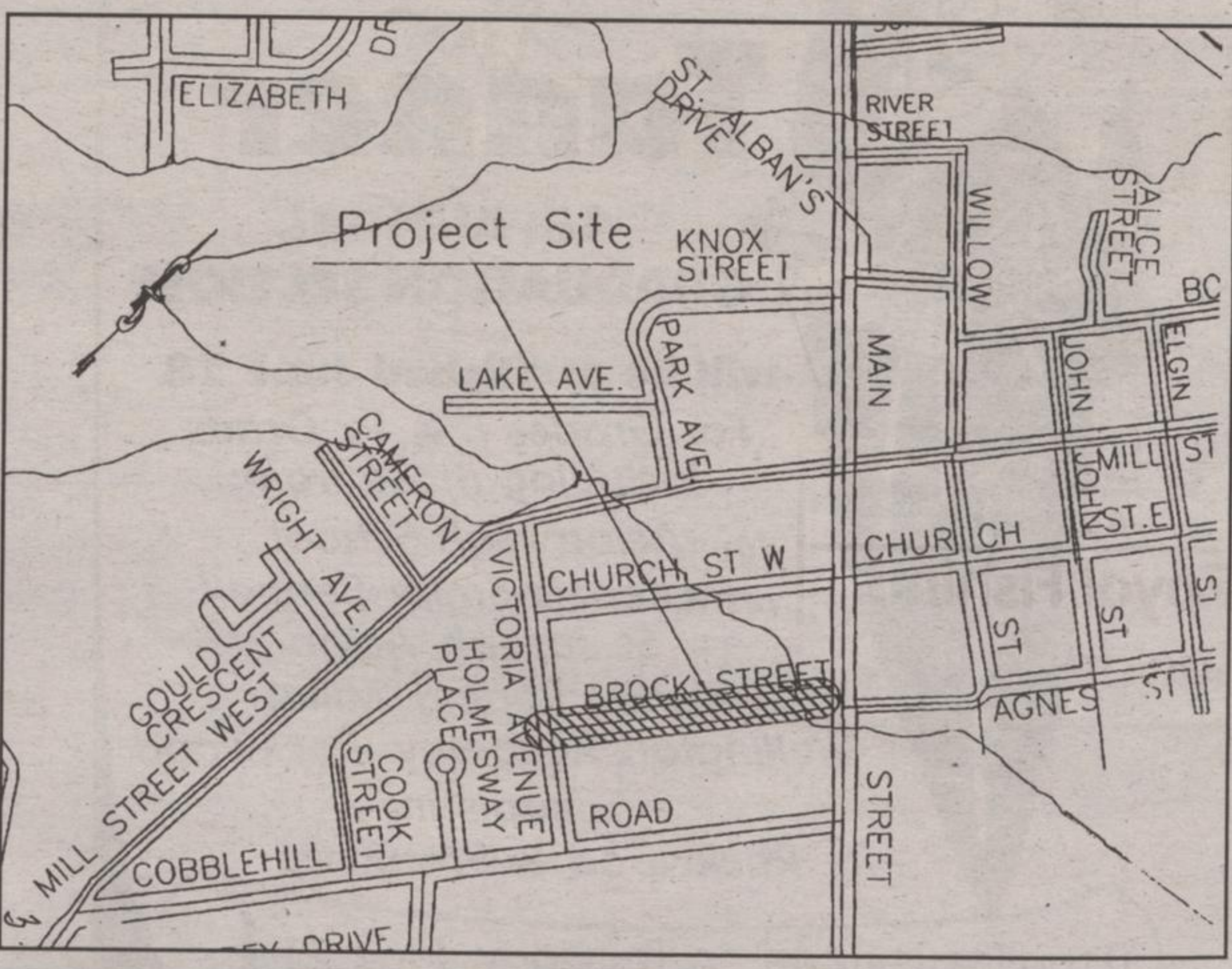
## TOWN OF HALTON HILLS
