At first, Chris Near's dad didn't like being regularly beaten on the links by his

son. But, now that Chris, 17, is the all-Halton high school golf champ, and will likely go to an American school on a golf scholarship, the elder Near doesn't mind so much.

"My beating him isn't a problem anymore," Near laughed after competing in the all-Ontario championship in Orillia last week.

While winning the all-Halton championship is the high point so far this year, Near isn't happy with his play at the cold and windy all-Ontario championship - he ran into trouble in the second round and finished 15th.

"I didn't play well, but I was still in contention until the second day when I just sucked," Near said on Friday.

"Nothing was going right - driving, putting irons - but I stayed with it."

In the first round of tworound total all-Halton tournament, played last Monday at Rattlesnake Golf Club in Milton, Near shot a 70 to put him in third place.

The next day at Blue Springs in Acton, he overcame cold, windy conditions to shoot a two-over par 74 low score of the day and the lowest two day score of any high school golfer in Halton - to claim the championship - the first Halton golfer to lead the field in the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference.

Near began golfing four years ago with some friends and was a natural, honing his skills at an Oakville golf dome in the winter and playing three or four rounds a week.

Near says he's a consistent player and this year he's really happy with his putting.

"It's saved me strokes on a number of occasions,"-Near said, adding golf has become a way of life, and he wouldn't be doing it if he didn't love it.

Coach/mentor, Acton Pastor Jamie Shepherd, who described Near as a low draw player, said after a few bad holes in the first round at the all-Ontario tournament, Near was five shots off the pace in fifth place heading into the final round.

Near started hot with a birdie, par, birdie on the first three holes and then overshot the green in a high wind.

"Really, winning the Halton was the key," Shepherd said last Thursday.

"It was a real learning experience to go to the all-Ontario and gives him something to work on for next year. His success was that when he had a couple of bad holes and knew he was out of it, he continued and finished the game and came through with a pretty good score."

Shepherd said he hasn't been able to give Near much, if any, technical advice, but has provided mental help and encouragement.

"Chris is a very talented golfer, a good kid and he works hard. He has the attitude that he'll keep working at it – that drive to improve – and that will be his biggest asset."

Near joins the Ontario Junior Golf Association Buick Tour this summer, playing his first tournament this weekend in Muskoka.
