A.	<b>Georgetown Fall Fair</b> From 3:00 p.m. on Friday September 7, 2001 to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday September 9, 2001.	Park Avenue, westbound from Charles Street to Fairgrounds.
B.	<b>Acton Fall Fair (Parade)</b> Saturday, September 15, 2001 from approximately 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.	Acton Boulevard to Mill Street East to Main Street North to Knox Avenue into Prospect Park.
C.	<b>Leathertown Festival (Acton)</b> Sunday, August 12, 2001 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.	Mill Street East between Main Street and Eastern Avenue, and Fellows Street from Mill Street East to Church Street East.

The Council Meeting will commence at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, July 9th, 2001 in the Council Chambers, Civic Centre, 1 Halton Hills Drive. At this meeting, Council will hear, in person, any person who claims to be prejudicially affected by the said by-law and who applies to the Town Clerk at 873-2601 x 2331, before the Council Meeting.

proachable person - I know staff always did, too," Andrew said, adding after decades on the job, Dave was not stuck in his ways and was willing to support new

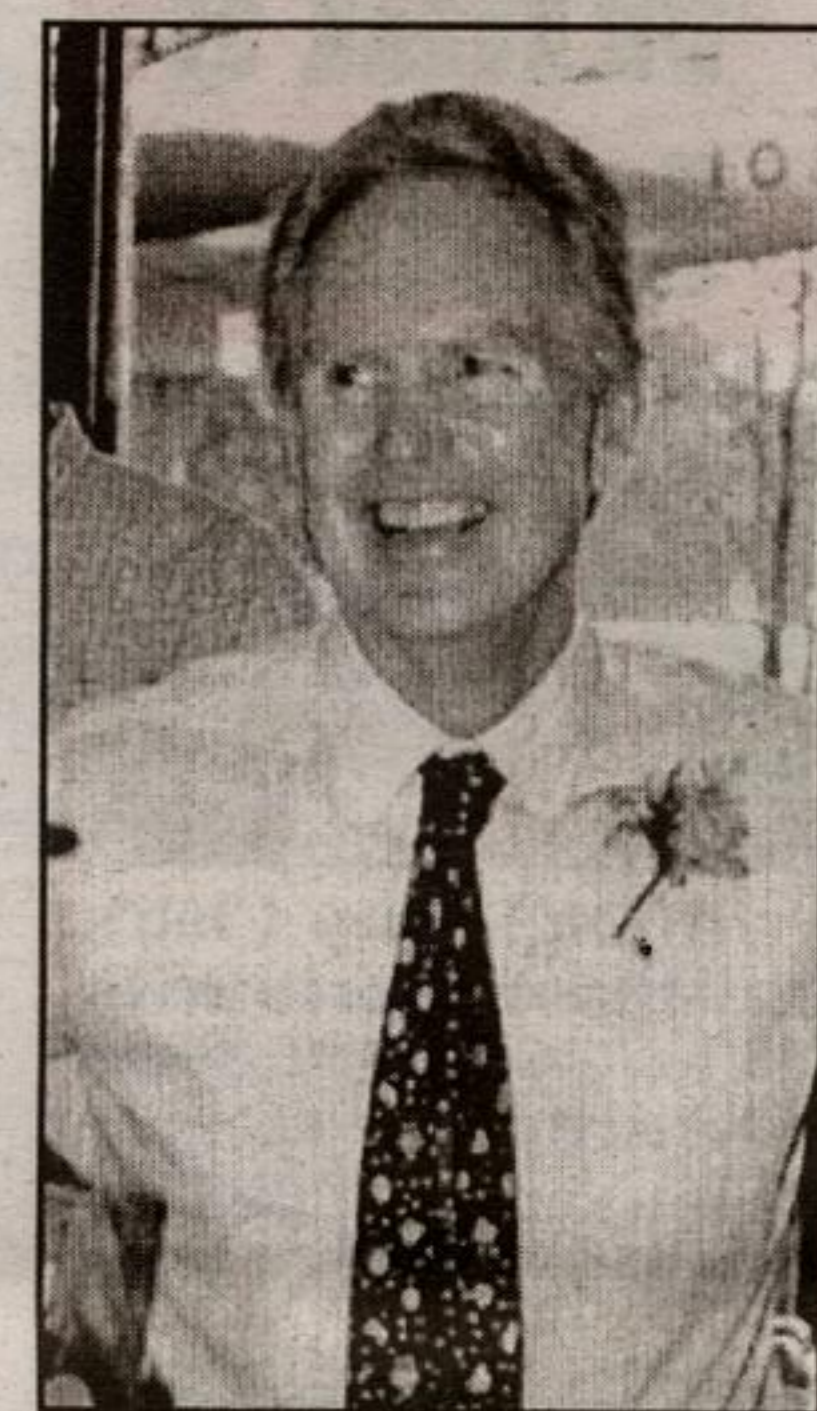
ideas, like the girl's hockey team that started up last year.

We know that as little as 10 minutes in the sun can cause exposed skin to burn. We know that the heat and humidity makes daily chores difficult and the nights very uncomfortable. Now take a moment and imagine what it would be like, if you were wearing a fur coat. Family pets suffer from the heat and humidity even more than ourselves.

Your Halton Regional Police Service and your local Animal Control Officer have recently rescued family pets, that unthinking people have left locked in cars or chained in the yard, in the blazing heat of the day.

I ask all pet owners to please provide plenty of fresh water and protection from the sun for all your pets.

Do not take family pets in the car, even for a short ride, in hot weather.

It takes just a few minutes for a car's interior to reach deadly temperatures.

Leaving the car windows down a couple of inches makes no difference.

At home, provide a cool, shady place for your pet to rest during the day.

Take the time to care.
