deaths on Fourth Line, the Main Street crossing gates were scheduled to be installed first. He also said the Town wanted traffic lights installed at the nearby intersection of Main Street North and Highway 7, but there's no money from the province for that project.

"It probably should be signalized, but it's the MTO's intersection and the MTO is backing away from that," Henry said on Friday, adding Transport Canada will pay for some curb improvements in the area to help with placement of the gate arm bases.


The project includes two safety gates that automatically drop down across the roadway when a motion sen-

sor detects a train within 3,000 feet of the crossing. The sensor gauges how fast the train is moving and triggers the lights, bells and arm drops when the train is 25 seconds

from the crossing.

The Town's consultant is preparing a tender for the crossing gate project that must be completed by November 30.

NOTICE OF PASSING OF ZONING BY-LAWS 01-074, 01-083 and 01-084 BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF **HALTON HILLS**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills passed By-law Number 01-074, 01-083 and 01-084 on the 18th day of June, 2001 under Section 34 of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, C.P. 13, amended.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-law by filing with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills not later than 4:30 p.m. on 19th day of July, 2001, a Notice of Appeal setting out the objection to the By-law and the reasons in support of the objection, accompanied by cheque in the amount of \$125.00 payable to the Minister of Finance.

The complete By-laws is available for inspection in the Clerk's Department during regular office hours. A key map is not attached as these By-law amendments affect all areas within the Town of Halton Hills.


The purpose of Zoning By-law Number 01-074, 01-083 and 01-084 which amend Zoning By-law Number 1358, Zoning By-law 57-91 and Zoning Bylaw 74-51 as amended, of the former Town of Georgetown, Acton and Esquesing now part of the Town of Halton Hills to examine the issue of parking and storage of motor homes, boats and large vehicles in residential areas throughout the Town of Halton Hills.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be made in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.
