# Municipal award winners

Four Acton athletes were among the seven Halton Hills individuals and two teams that were honoured at a municipal awards ceremony at the Civic Centre recently.

The awards are designed to allow the Town to show appreciation to the people who have brought recognition and honour to Halton Hills through their achievements in academics, arts culture, sports and recreational pursuits.

Acton brothers, Kyle and Eric Pinkerton, were honoured for their medal finishes at the 2000 North American Tae Kwon Do championships in Aylmer, Quebec.

Kyle, 13, has been a student at Master Tae Kwon Do School in Acton for one year, and Eric has been studying the martial art for three years and is also an assistant instructor. Kyle won Silver in patterns at the competition, and Eric, 16, captured Silver and Bronze medals in sparring.

Acton soccer ace, Spencer Morrison, was honoured by the Town as a member of the Gold medal-winning Burling-ton Bulldogs, under-12 soccer team that won the 2000 Ontario Cup.

Known for his speed, the Grade 7 student at McKenzie-Smith Bennett School plays right forward and right defence and helped his team to overtime win at the championship.

One of the fastest harness racers in Ontario, Acton's Trevor Ritchie, received a municipal award for winning the 2000 Breeders Crown Championship. In the 2000 season, the horses Ritchie piloted earned a career-high \$4.9-million.

His 22-year career includes a North American victory and a win at Meadow-lands Race Track in New Jersey – the first time a Canadian-sired horse won the competition. Ritchie also captured the O'Brien Award, given to the best driver in Canada, and steered Yankee Paco, the overall horse of the year, to victory.

Ritchie was named Canadian driver of the year at the national horse racing awards and capped a great season with three first place finishes at the Canadian Breeders Crown national championship—tying the record for the most wins in one night.

Nominations are now being accepted for the next municipal awards ceremony in September.


Acton Super Submarine washed out Royal City Realty 11-1, in boys under-11 soccer action.
