with oxygen in the ambulance and again at the hospital. They complained of nausea, dizziness and trouble breathing.

Parents were still concerned about any lasting effects the illness might have on their children. One told The New Tanner they were disappointed with the report they got from the two hospitals involved. Georgetown hospital officials told them the kids were having "panic attacks," while Milton suggested that since mostly girls were involved it was a sympathetic syndrome.

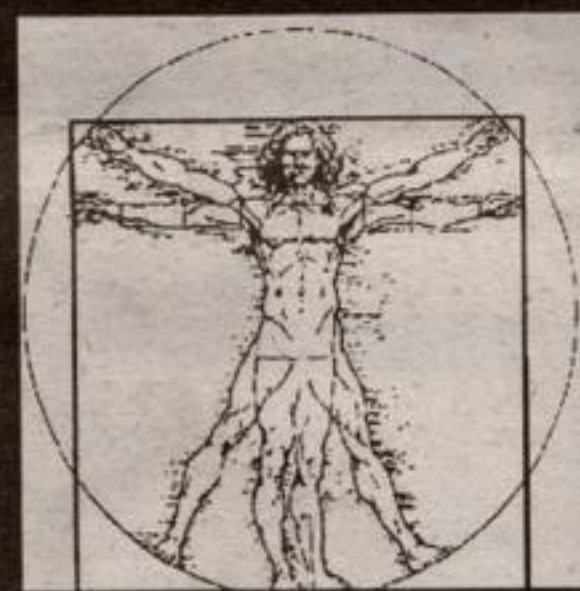
The parents said the \$45.00 ambulance bill did not help their feelings about the suggestion it was hallucinatory. She said her child still had dilated pupils three days later and complained of a headache, rubbery legs and couldn't sleep. She is feeling better now, she said.

Children said and odor at the camp smelled like "smelly feet" but when they moved around it stayed in the room.
