that in 1879 Robert Little recommended the formation of Township School Boards and a uniform rate of school tax for each township in Halton and since township councils were not required to levy and collect school taxes he recommended that county council levy and collect a sum equal to one-half the average salaries of the teachers in the township.

In those early days the Smith Residence had water piped form Henderson's Pond and the overflow from this home supplied beautiful lily ponds on the property. The rooms were spacious and the family, which always dressed for dinner, loved to entertain.

When Mr. Smith died in 1885 Mrs. Smith's parents, Colonel and Mrs. Allen lived with her.

Colonel was very strict and when the students were a nuisance he would visit the principal in his full dress uniform and musket to demand better supervision. Along the high board fence grew luscious grapes and many a boy risked being caught to swipe a few apples from the orchard. A horse whip was used to chase them back to the school playgrounds and my, did it hurt, if you were caught.


When Colonel Allen died he was given a full dress military funeral. A gun carriage was used to convey his cof-

fin which was draped by a flag, to Fairview Cemetery, the Halton Rifles regiment paraded and the school children enjoyed a holiday. After the fire in 1925 Mrs. Smith lived for a while with her son Allan who operated the Veterans' home. (It is now operated as Shoemaker Funeral Home.)

In 1927 Fairview was opened as Acton High School with Miss Margaret Macdonald as principal (Mrs. John Dennis is her sister) and Miss Frances Hurst (Joe Hurst's sister) and Bertha Nephew (Mrs. Doctor Buchanan) were teachers.






