Saturday features a parade, the annual baby contest and live entertainment at night with

performances by Vivid, an Acton band fronted by Jenn Johnson, and a country-flavoured set from the Williams sisters.

Almost 1,000 local school children, nursery school to

Grade 5, will throng to the fairgrounds tomorrow (Friday) to take part in Education Day activities designed to show case the rural way of life.

Education Day organizer Linda Inglis says popular events like sack races and a Canadian trivia contest are "good, clean agriculturally-

related fun," for the school kids who also enjoy the corn maze and farm competitions.

"The events don't have any winners, but involve kids having fun and learning about agricultural life," Inglis said, adding she always gets a good contingent of students from Acton High School to help with the day, even though it can't be counted as part of their mandatory community work.

The Homecraft division theme this year is "Corn of Plenty" and most categories include the use of corn in some way.

Homecraft chairperson Kathryn Brown expects a good selection of entries, but predicts there will be fewer in some categories again this year as people are concerned about security and the weather as the entries are displayed in a tent on the tennis court.

Brown, who entered Homecraft Division categories as a child, said Homecrafts are an "important, integral part of the history of the fair," and are a tradition that needs to be preserved. The popular wine-judging event, new last year, has been expanded this year and Brown predicts a large number of entries from school children again this year.

Despite cool weather, last year's fair generated a net profit of \$26,321.

While Fair officials each have a favourite event or show, they all want one thing this year - good weather.
