Hi again:

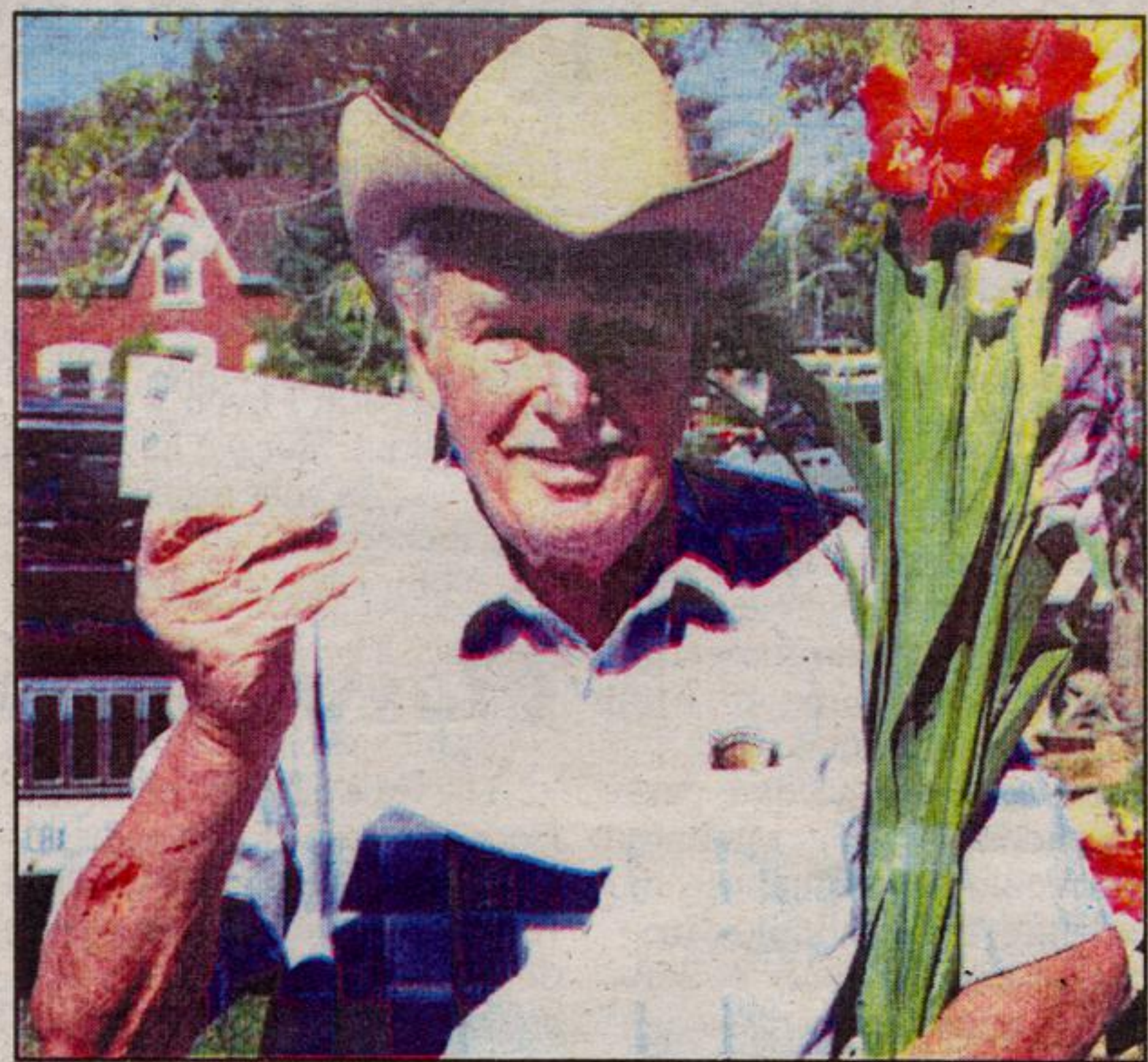
Such a beautiful weekend after the cool week. Now October is here.
