

Firearms

Continuing with our theme on safe storage, transport and disply of firearms.

Antique Firearms

Some Acton residents possess old firearms, perhaps handed down from one generation to the next. It's important to note that not all old firearms are classified as antique. For the purposes of the Firearms Act and regulations, antique firearms include:

- · Firearms manufactured before 1898 that were not designed or re-designed to fire rim-fire or centrefire ammunition, or
- Firearms prescribed as antique in the Criminal Code regulations.

Antique firearms must be unloaded for storage, display and transportation. During transport, antique handguns must be locked in a heavy-duty container that you cannot see through and that cannot easily break open during transport. If you are leaving an antique firearm in an unattended vehicle:

- 1) Lock it in the trunk or similar lockable compartment.
- 2) If the vehicle does not have a trunk or compartment that can be locked, put it out of sight inside the vehicle and lock the vehicle.

Replica Firearms

You should store and display replica firearms safely to prevent loss and theft. During transport, replica firearms must be locked in the trunk or a similar lockable compartment.

If the vehicle does not have a trunk or similar lockable compartment, replica firearms must be out of sight inside the vehicle, and the vehicle must be locked.
