In January 1973, the Centennial Committee put forth a presentation and application to the CFL's Jake Gaudaur for the 1974 Grey Cup classic. Gaudaur said the 'very impressive brief' was given to the League but it was rejected.

I asked my dad, "Did you really think you were going to get the Grey Cup?" He was a little evasive about the answer, but like Hartley the memories brought a smile to his face. And when I called Harold Townsley to talk about it I knew he was smiling as well. Hartley said he

didn't think they would get it, but the CFL did take them seriously and they had hopes of getting the exhibition game between the Argos and the Tiger Cats that year.

Later, Jack Carpenter reported that Gaudaur said, "Perhaps you might want to apply again or maybe even



development centres. The early child development centres provide a wide-variety of programs to the community, including parenting class and instruction on proper nutrition and exercise. The programs will be designed to ensure that children get off to a good start in life, particularly in the critical pre-school years

In order to achieve these

goals, a 10 member Steering Committee, representing a broad range of interests within the Halton Region, has been formed with Wayne Hussey as chair.


Work has begun on identifying existing local early child development services and resources. "We need to identify the gaps and pressures on existing services," says Lynn Roberts, the com-

munity coorindator. Following this, an Early Years action plan will be developed.

We are really looking at social change", said Chairman Wayne Hussey. "Our job is to get parents and the community to understand the importance of the 0-6 years and what part everyone can play in providing these youngsters with the enriched environment they need for healthy brain development. We are looking at the next generation who, as adults, will be more productive, with better health, and do better in school because they have had community support. The strength of our social and economic future depends on the investment we make in early years today."
